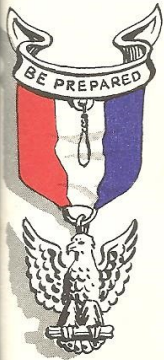

### AREA VI E HISTORY

The 1965 Area VI E Conference not only serves to celebrate our order's Golden Anniversary, but it also serves to celebrate the 20th Anniversary of Area VI E. Area VI E established the idea of an Area Conference in 1945 at Camp Echockotee near Orange Park, Florida.

The Lodges which comprised the Area at that time were: Aal-Pa-Tah, Calusa, Echockotee, Kiondashama, O-Shot-Caw, Pilthlako, Semialachee and Tipisa.

Kiondashama was later re-named Seminole. Calusa Lodge was dropped and later re-organized as Eckale-Yakanen. Pilthlako was moved to Area VI C and the next year to Area VI D. Semialachee has been moved to Area VI D. Timuquan and Chiriqui Lodges were formed in the very late 1940's.

The Totem of each of these Lodges is represented on the Conference neckerchief.

The pocket patch serves as a tribute to Billy Bowlegs III (1863-1965), a nephew of the Great Billy Bowlegs of Seminole war fame. This great Indian's name shall forever be remembered among the Seminoles as a leader.

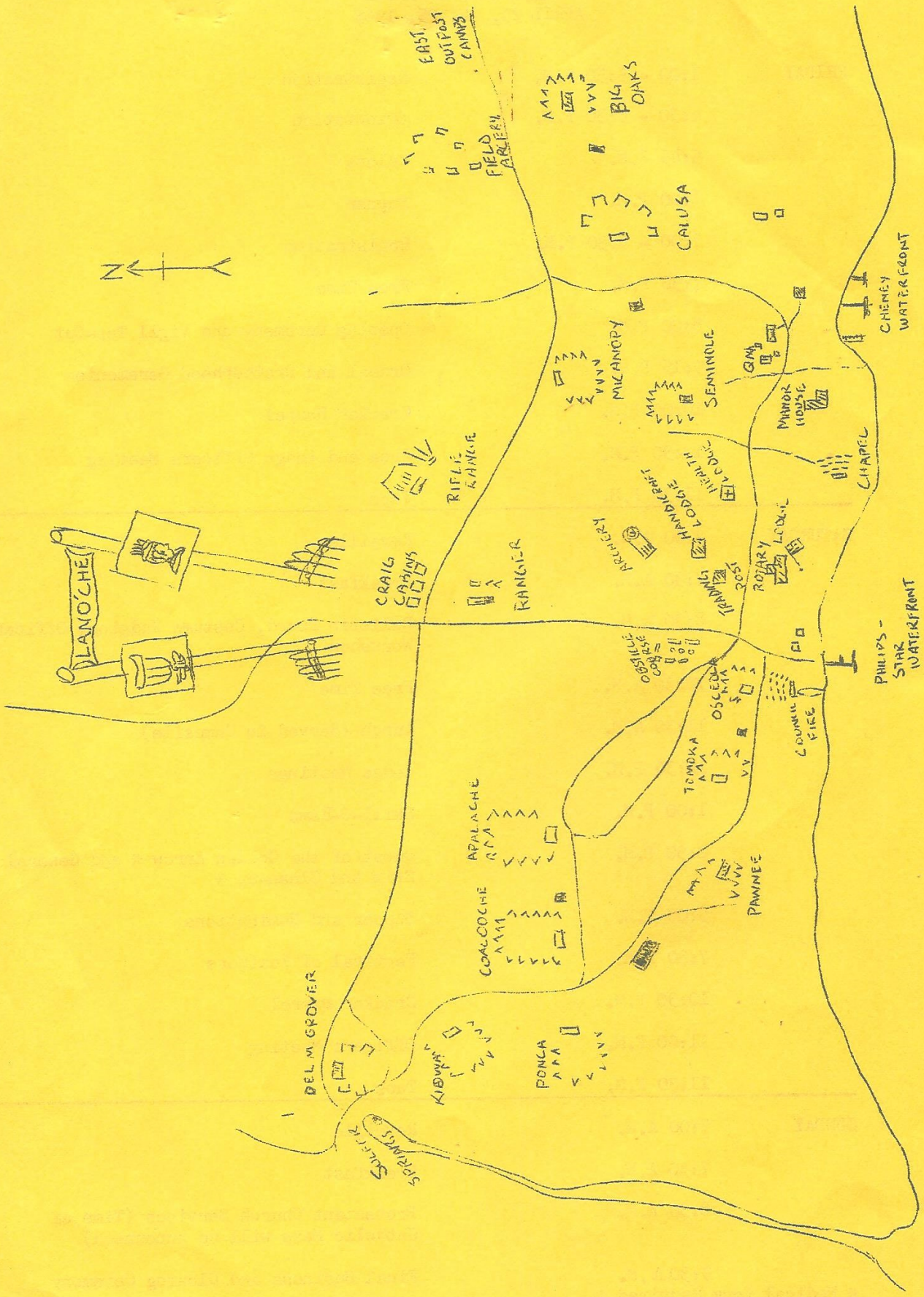
