

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

1. All vehicles are to be parked in the parking lot. No vehicles will be allowed outside parking area. Don't leave camp unless approved by an Area Officer at the Administration Building.
2. The appropriate meal ticket is to be turned in at each meal. Write your name and lodge on the back of each ticket. The Lodge Secretary will be responsible for collection.
3. A neckerchief ticket will be issued with your registration kit and must be used to purchase neckerchief. This must be done before 7:00 P.M. on Saturday. Neckerchiefs left over after that time will be sold on a first come basis at the trading post.
4. Each arrowman registering will receive one pocket patch with his kit. Patches left over will be sold after 7:00 P.M. Saturday.
5. Arrowmen are expected to wear complete and proper uniform at all times.
6. Protestant Church services will be held in the camp chapel. The time the place of Catholic Mass will be announced later.
7. There will be a rehearsal for the Festival of Feathers with all lighting directors after the opening ceremony. Someone who knows the dance and lighting cues must attend.
8. Check out Sunday morning. Each Lodge is requested to carefully take down their tents just before checking out and roll them in a prescribed manner. A member of the host lodge will be on hand to assist you. Tents are to be left up if the rest bit damp.

1. Objectives

L

- a. To emphasize Scouting as well as Scoutcraft. - Order of the Arrow Handbook - Forward by E. Urner Goodman.
- b. To glorify the Scout Oath and Law in the mind of the Scout camper.
- c. To emphasize cheerful service as an essential to a happy camping experience.
- d. To reveal and interpret the true brotherhood among those who exhibit such traits.

2. Purposes - Order of the Arrow Handbook, page 5

- a. To recognize those Scout campers who best exemplify the spirit of the Scout Oath and Law - that they may be an example to others.
- b. To develop and maintain camping traditions and spirit.
- c. To promote Scout camping - where it reaches its greatest effectiveness in the year-round program.
- d. To crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others.

3. Relationships to Scouting

- a. It is a part of the camping program of Scouting.
- b. It has its roots in the troop or Explorer unit that goes camping.
- c. In its local setting the lodge activities are a part of the council and district program, recognized and guided by the Scout executive as Supreme Chief of the Fire through the camping and activities committee, the lodge adviser, and the officers elected by the members of the lodge.
- d. In large lodges, activities are quite often carried out on a chapter basis covering areas or districts of the council. In such cases the pattern is the same - except that district or field executive may represent the Scout executive and there is a chapter adviser.
