GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

We welcome you to Camp La-No'-Che and the Central Florida Council. We sincerely hope you will enjoy your stay. The general rule to a happy experience in any camp is observance of the SCOUT OATH and SCOUT LAW, and we observe this policy here on a year round basis.

The following information is supplied to hopefully answer most of your questions. If you have any additional questions, please ask any member of our lodge.

1. Your conference fee covers the cost of your meals, housing, conference program and one conference patch. Additional patches are on sale at the Trading Post. \$1.00 each.
2. A conference neckerchief is available for sale at the Trading Post. The coupon in your registration materials entitles you to purchase one (\$3.50). Additional neckerchief's can be purchased on a first come basis.
3. Lodges are camped together in Troop Campsites. Locations of all lodges are listed at the end of these instructions so you may visit friends. Lodges are responsible for the general cleanliness of its area. Your cooperation will be appreciated.
4. Vehicles are not allowed in troop campsites. Please park your vehicle in the parking area.
5. First Aid assistance is available at the Health Lodge (see Map) 24 hours a day.
6. All meals will be in the Dining Hall. Please be on time so we may observe the conference schedule.
7. DO NOT LEAVE CAMP without checking out with your Lodge Advisor and Conference Headquarters.
8. Conference Headquarters is located in the Seminole Campsite.
9. Arrowmen are expected to wear complete & proper uniform at all times.
10. Protestant Church Services will be held in the Chapel on Sunday morning. Arrangements for Catholic services will be announced.
11. Check out time is Sunday morning. Please do the following:
 - (1) Move the bunks to the center of the tent, side-by-side.
 - (2) Place the mattress from your bunk on a table in the covered dining hall in your site after removing the mattress cover.
 - (3) Leave your mattress cover on your bunk.
 - (4) Please leave your campsite cleaner than you found it.
12. The Camp Trading Post will be open at regular intervals to serve your needs.
13. While our Conference is in progress members of various Regional and National Camping Schools will be here undergoing training. They will be staying in the "Minor House". Please avoid this area so as to avoid disturbing these men while they are at work.

Thank you so much for your co-operation. Now go enjoy yourself!

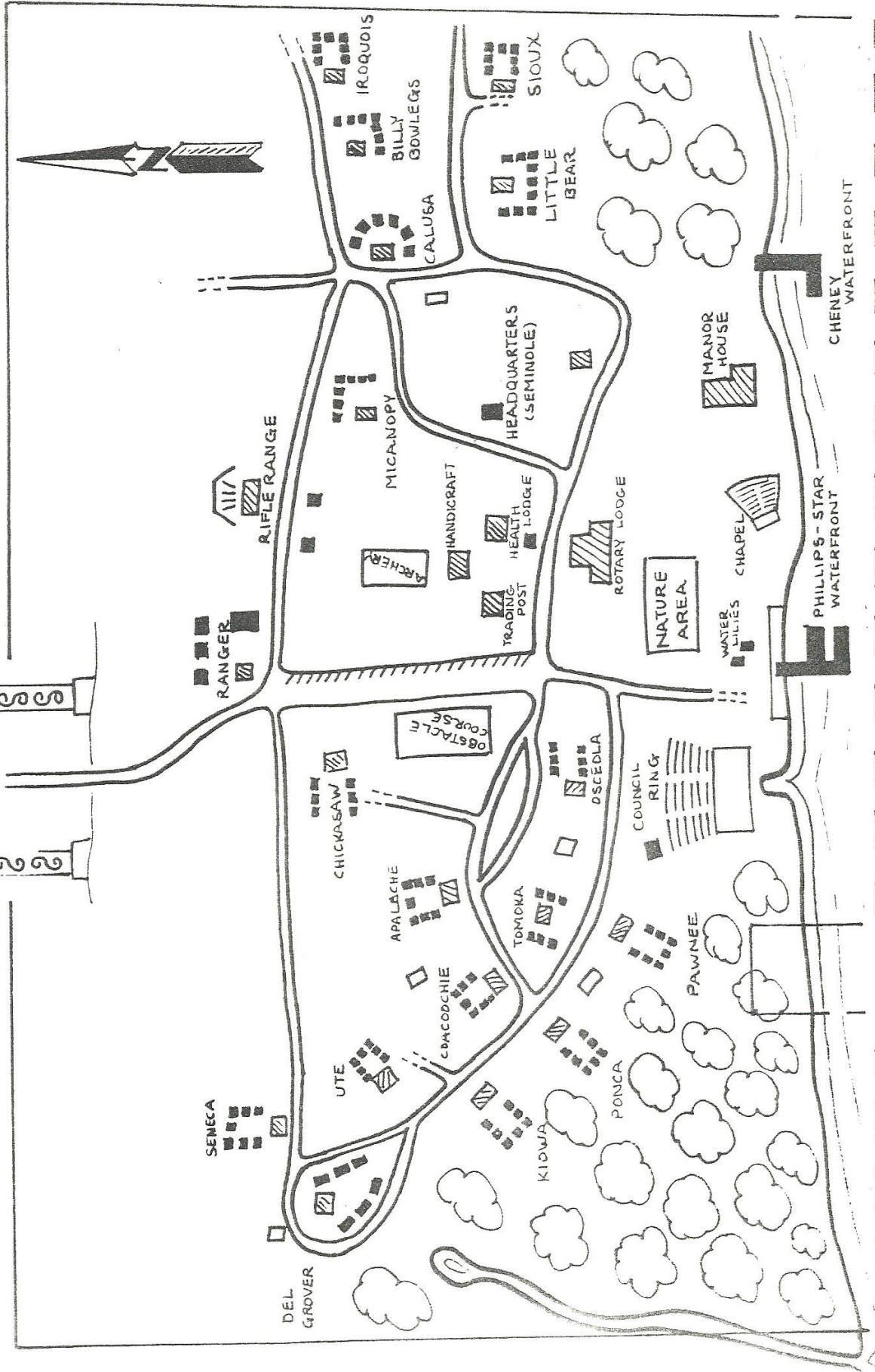

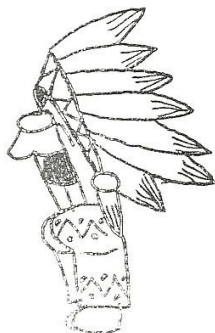

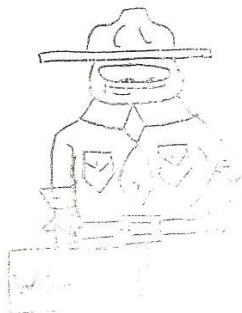

AREA VI E HISTORY

The 1970 Area VI E Conference serves to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of Area VI E. Area VI E established the idea of an Area Conference in 1945 at Camp Echockotee near Orange Park, Florida.

The Lodges which comprised the Area at that time were Aal-Pa-Tah, Calusa, Echockotee, Kiondashama, O-Shot-Caw, Pilthlako, Semialachee and Tipisa.

Kiondashama was later re-named Seminole. Calusa Lodge was dropped and later reorganized as Eckale-Yakanen. Philthlako was moved to Area VI C and the next year to Area VI D. Semialachee has been moved to Area VI D. Timuquan and Chiriqui Lodges were formed in the very late 1940's. In 1968, Echockotee Lodge was transferred to Area VI C, and Osceola Lodge of S.W. Florida Council was formed and added to area.
