Conference Rules
Section 6 Conference

The general welfare of any group depends on the conduct of the individual member. This ensures the success of our conference and provides the maximum benefit to every participant. The Arrowman understands this and supports the reasonable demands of conduct expected of him.

1. The Arrowman observes the Scout Oath or Promise and Law, the Explorer Code, and the Order of the Arrow Obligation.
2. The Arrowman wears his official uniform throughout the conference. He avoids wearing unofficial hats, patch jackets, medals or decorations.
3. The Arrowman confines trading and swapping to free periods.
4. The Arrowman attends all training and general sessions.
5. The Arrowman is personally responsible for breakage, damage, or loss of property.
6. The Arrowman observes quiet hours and lights out from 12 p.m. to 7 a.m.
7. The Arrowman keeps his quarters clean, his bed made, and disposes of trash in the proper place.
8. The Arrowman respects the State Laws and the reservation regulation prohibiting the possession or use of drugs and alcoholic beverages in any form on the reservation and those covering fireworks, firearms, and gambling. Infraction of these regulations will be cause for immediate dismissal from the conference.
9. The Arrowman respects the rule prohibiting use of private automobiles on the reservation without permission from conference headquarters.
10. The Arrowman, before the end of the conference, makes sure that the area is clean and completely free of litter and all fires are completely out.
11. The Arrowman shall not leave the reservation without permission from the conference headquarters.

Conference Headquarters

Conference Headquarters will be in the Camp Headquarters. Consult the enclosed map for the location.

Fee

Your registration fee of \$8.00 covers the food cost, insurance, and one conference patch.

Souvenirs

Additional patches, mugs, neckerchiefs, etc. will be sold at the trading post. One neckerchief and mug will be reserved for each Arrowman until one half hour before Saturday supper. At this time all conference items will go on sale to anyone. You MUST present your meal ticket to purchase your reserved conference neckerchief.

Camp Sites

All lodges are solely responsible for the cleanliness of their own camp site. Your lodges' campsite is it's home for the weekend. Your campsite must be inspected before you leave camp. Please do not enter another lodges' campsite unless you are invited.

Vehicles

Vehicles are not permitted inside camp. Please use the designated parking places only. (In the Camporee field, parking lot at entrance of camp)

Leaving Camp

No one shall leave camp without first checking out with their lodge chief and then with the Conference Headquarters.

First Aid

First Aid is available at the Health Lodge during the entire Conclave. An emergency vehicle will be on hand to transport patients requiring further attention.

Meals

Meals will be served in the Dining Hall. Each person must present their meal ticket at every meal. Lodges will be given colored meal tickets

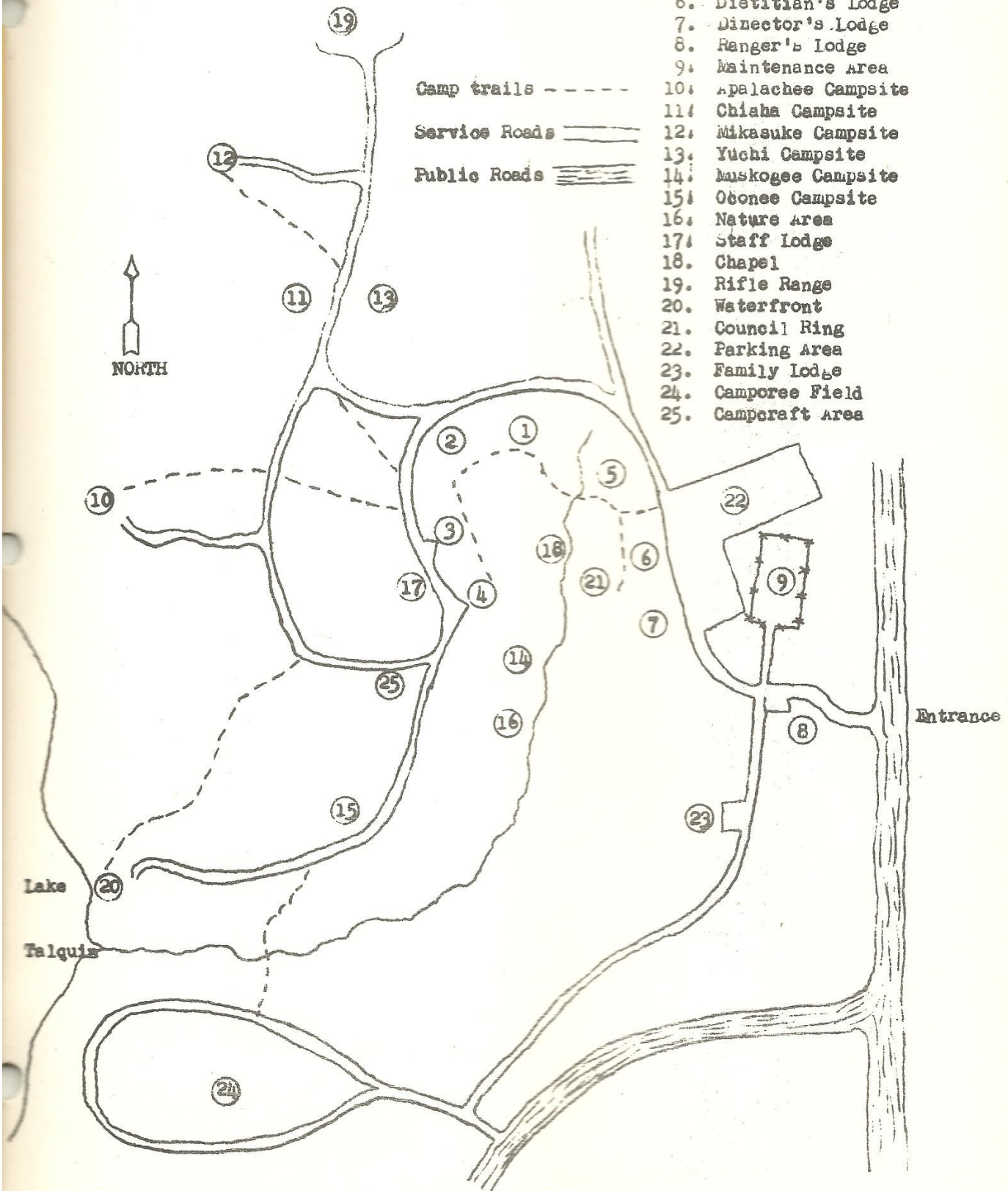

AREA HISTORY

Area VI-E and the idea of an annual Area Conference was established in 1945 at Camp Echockotee near Orange Park, Florida. The eight original Area VI-A Lodges were: Aal-Pah-Tah, Calusa, Echockotee, Kiondasha, O-Shot-Caw, Pilthako, Semilachee, and Tipisa.

Many changes have occurred with Florida Lodges since then. Kiondasha was later renamed Seminole. Calusa Lodge was dropped and later reorganized as Eckale-Yakanen. Pilthako was moved to Area VI-C and the next year to Area VI-D. Semilachee was moved to VI-D. Timuquan and Chiriqui Lodges were formed in the very late 1940's (Timuquan in 1948). At one time O-Shot-Caw was dropped but later reformed in the mid 1950's under the same name. In 1968 Echockotee Lodge was transferred to Area VI-C and Osceola Lodge was formed and added to the Area.

Area VI-E retired in 1972 with a history of 27 great years behind it. April 27, 28, and 29, 1973, is the first conference of Florida Lodges under their new organization as Section 6, and Semilachee Lodge has the honor of hosting it.
