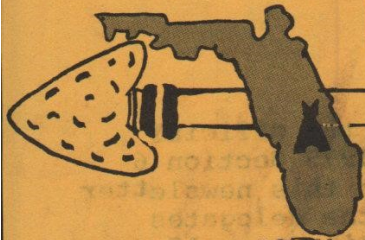
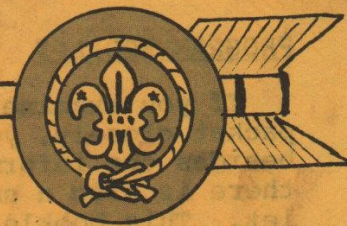

PROGRAM BOOKLET

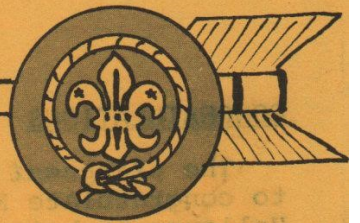

Edson founded the Order at Treasure Island (north of Trenton, N.J.), an early camping ground of the Lenni Lenape Indians. Dr. Goodman has served Scouting diligently as a Scoutmaster and later a Professionals Scouter in the posts of Scout Executive in Philadelphia and Chicago and as the Director of Program Division, Boy Scouts of America.
