

Rules and Information

VEHICLES

All vehicles are to be parked in the parking lot located in the Camporee Field. Only one vehicle will be allowed in camp or outside of the designated parking areas (with proper approval).

LIABILITY

All Lodges will be responsible financially and accordingly for any property or physical damage done to the camp or another Lodge by its delegates.

LEAVING CAMP

No one will be allowed to leave camp during the conference without good reason. Check with your lodge advisor and a Section Officer first.

VISITING OTHER LODGES

A Lodge's campsite is their home. Be an invited guest before entering and act accordingly.

TRAINING FLIGHTS

Delegates are requested to attend all planned training sessions and general discussions.

UNIFORMING

It is recommended that all brothers remain in proper uniform throughout the weekend. This will be a consideration toward the trophy for the best-all-around lodge.

LITTERING

Waste cans have been provided throughout the camp for disposal of all garbage. Please use them and refrain from littering the camp. We of Tipisa wish to keep our camp clean and beautiful. We hope you will help us out with proper waste disposal.



FIRST AID

Please report all accidents to the Health Lodge. It will be attended 24 hours a day. Foot covering must be worn at all times.

CONFERENCE HEADQUARTERS

The Conference Headquarters will be located in the Ranger's old compound area, near the Handicraft shelter. Please refer to the map in your small booklet.

PHONE CALLS

All phone calls will be placed from the Rotary Lodge. The approval of your Lodge Lay Advisor and the Section Lay Advisor will be necessary before placing the call.

TRADING POST

Two Trading Posts will be open throughout the weekend. The OA Trading Post, adjacent to the Camp Trading Post will be selling Section Conference and National items. Times for both trading posts are printed in your small booklet, and will be in Friday nights newsletter for your convenience.

MEAL TIMES

All meals will be in the Rotary Lodge. Meals will run on three shifts. Be sure to check the color of your small Program Booklet for your scheduled meal time.

PATCH TRADING

All patch trading will take place during free periods. The circus tent and all campsite shelters will be lit up for this reason. Please observe common courtesy after taps.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

Church services will be held Saturday Evening at 5:00 for all Arrowmen. Catholic mass as well as Protestant Vesper services will be held. Locations will be announced in the Saturday newsletter.



Quest for the Golden Arrow

The Quest for the Golden Arrow is divided into three parts. Events 1-2-3 will be run simultaneously, then events 4-5-6 will be run in the order as listed. After the Quest for the Golden Arrow is over, the Sink-A-Thon and the Tug-O-War will be held. All competitors must be under the age of 21.

QUEST EVENTS

- Survival of the Fittest 2 men per lodge, compete for best overall time. After the first man crosses the wall completely, the second man can begin. Standards range from hand-over-hand walk, rope swing, walking a fence, and the dreaded wall climb. Object is for both men to cover the course in the shortest time.
- 2. 6 Man 7 Legged Race 6 men per lodge compete for best time. The legs of six men will be tied together and they will travel for 30 yards.
- 3. Flagpole Raising 4 men per lodge for best time. 3 men will lash three poles together to form one. The forth man will tie a banner to the top of the pole and attach guide wires to the pole. After the lashings are completed, the pole is raised, and the guide wires staked.
- 4. Cance Race 4 per lodge for the best time. 2 men with paddles will canoe from one waterfront to another, change the men, and the new men will canoe back to the beginning. The race is for best speed and skill.
- 5. Swim Relay 4 men form each Lodge compete for best time.

 Each person will swim one length, or 50 feet. Butterfly,
 back, brest, and free will be used in that order.

 The first team to finish is the winner.
- 6. Ping-Pong Ball Blow 4 people per lodge will compete for speed. Each participant will blow a ping-pong ball back and forth across the pool, about 25 feet.

 No hand or body language is allowed.



CHECK OUT

All campsites must be inspected by the Tipisa lodge host representative.

We hope that all arrowmen will govern their activities be the Scout Oath and Law. Each person will be expected to observe state and local laws and camp regulations. Use of drugs, alcohol, fireworks, firearms, or gambling will not be tolerated. Anyone violating these regulations will be turned over to the local authorities. The area of the Ranger's house is off limits during the entire conference except in extreme emergencies. Enjoy the weekend and don't hesitate to ask any Tipisa member for any needed help.

GOLDEN ARROW

The GOLDEN ARROW will be the official newsletter for the 1980 SE-6 Conference. It will be distributed four times during the weekend: Friday evening, Saturday morning, Saturday evening, and Sunday morning. It will contain valuable and interesting information. Please be sure to watch it closely for any schedule changes. The GOLDEN ARROW will be distributed at the Rotary Lodge during meals, and at the Trading Posts. The Sink-A-Thon and the Tug-O-War are not included in the Quest for the Golden Arrow.

Sink-A-Thon - 2 Adults from each Lodge get one paddle and one #10 can and attempt to sink Advisors from the other Lodges in the Section. No bailing of canoes will be allowed.

Tug-O-War - 5 members per Lodge. Each team will be positioned on either side of the Lanoche Mud Bath, and will try to tug the other team into the mud bath using the tug rope. The starting position will be standing with hands over head, the rope on the ground. Smooth soles must be worn, with no molded extrusions from the heels or soles.
