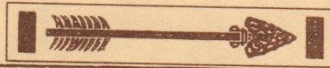
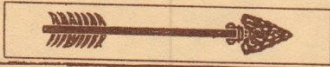
PROGRAM BOOKLET

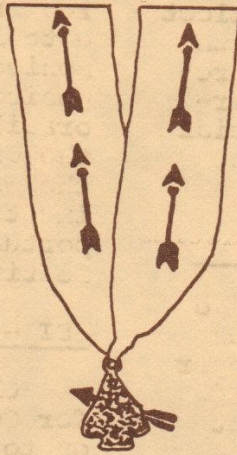
FIRST AID

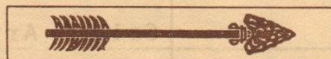

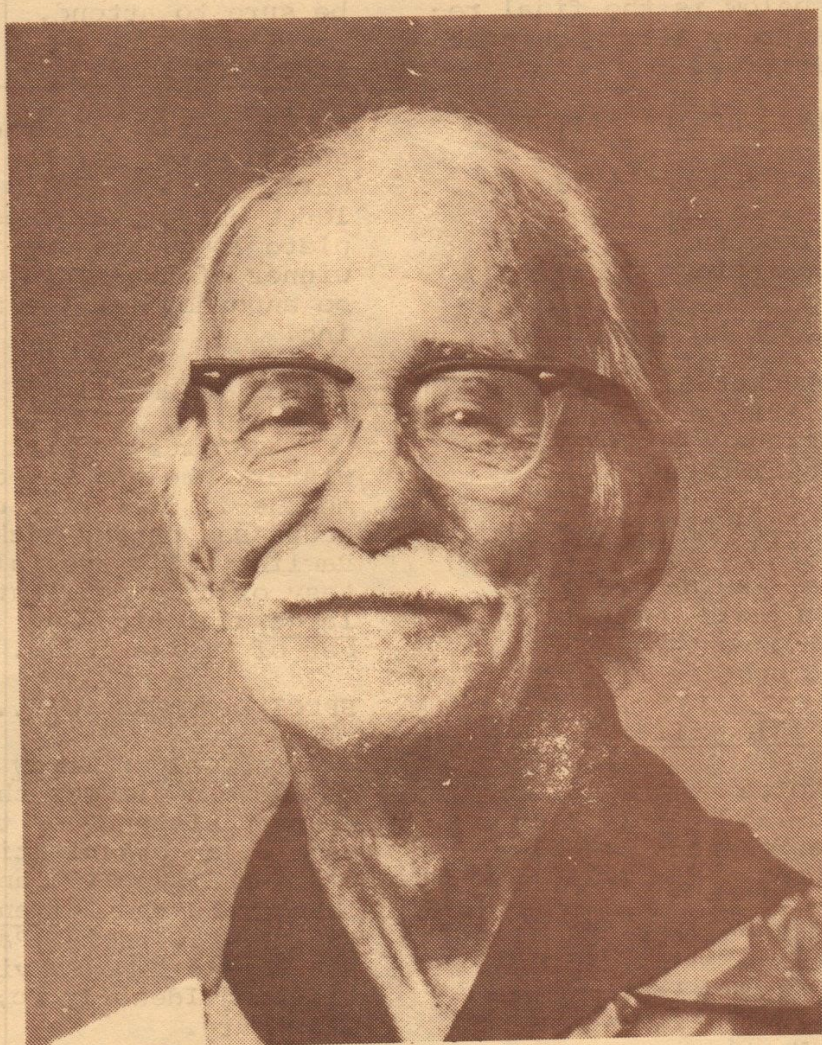
