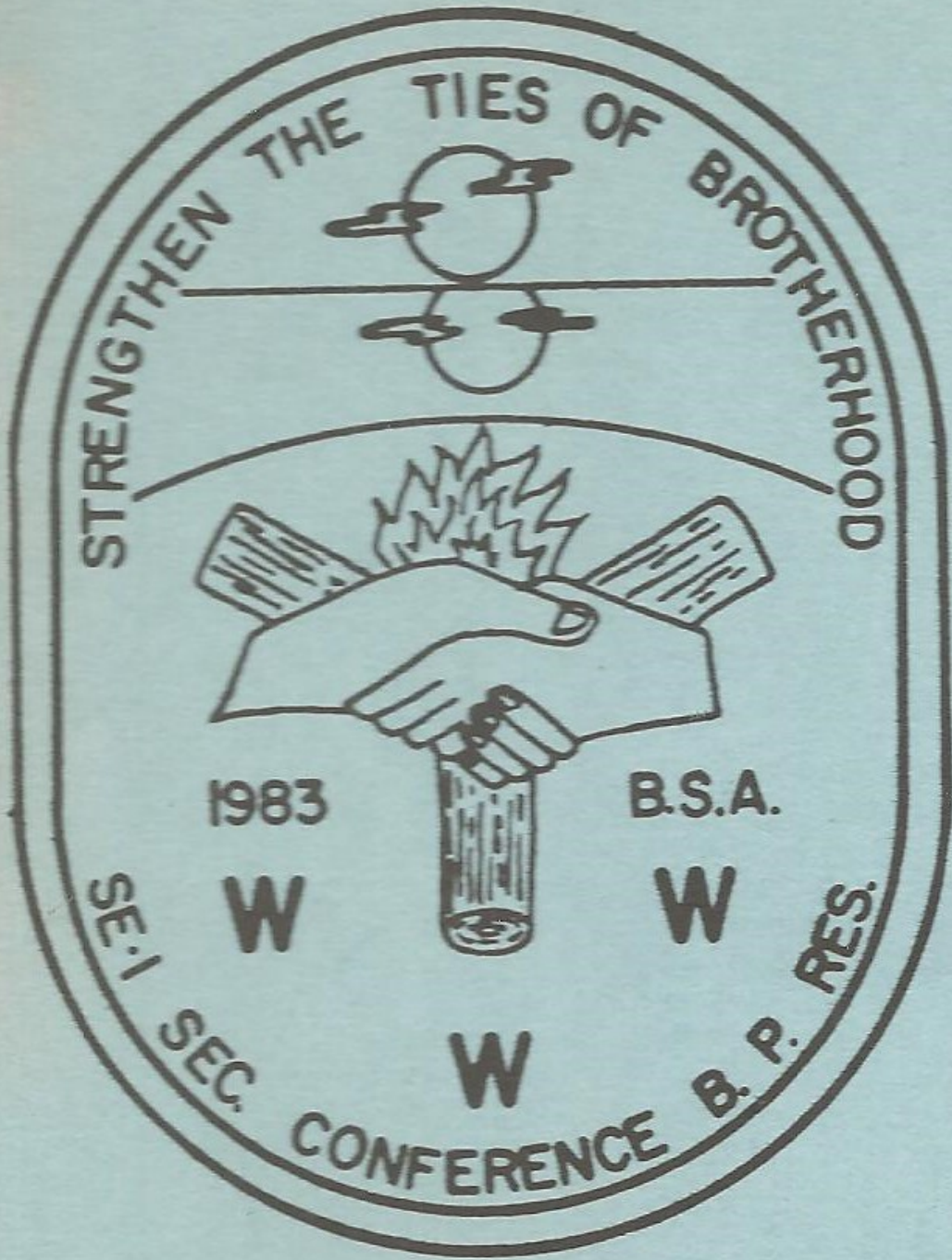

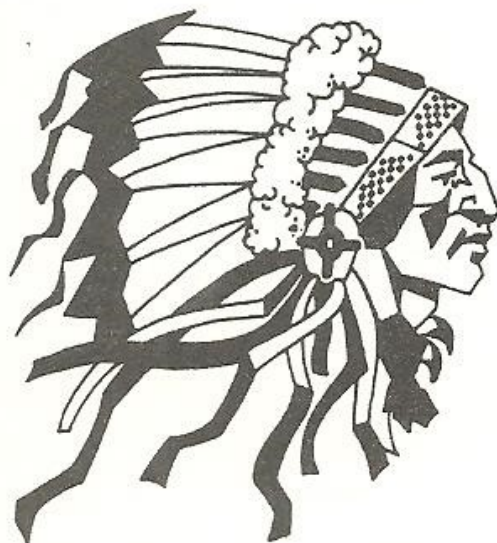

Why Training?

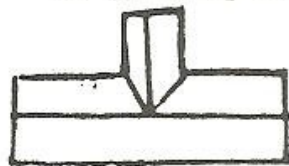

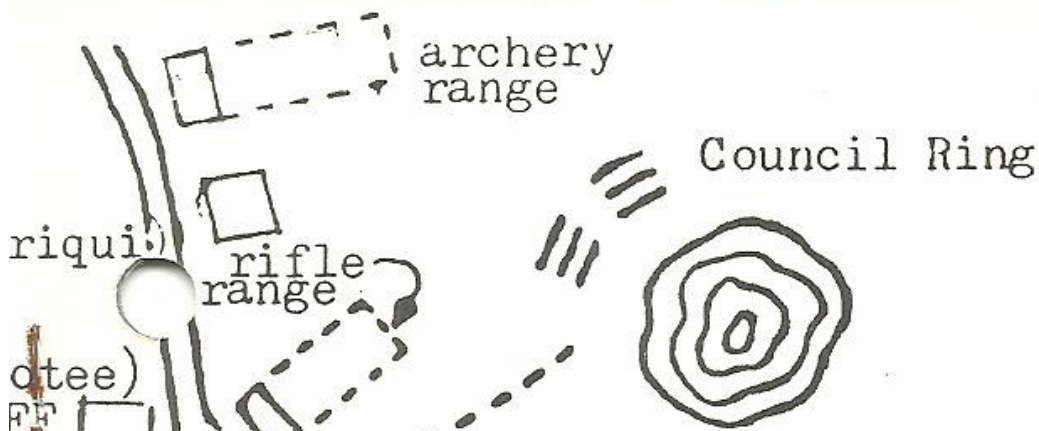
