THE QUEST

1. Marksmanship - 3 participants. A .22 caliber rifle without scope for target shooting and ammunition provided. No slings. Prone position.
2. Archery - 2 participants. Aluminum or wood target arrows and a standardized bow provided.
3. Cross-cut Saw - 2 teams of 2 participants. Saw a 4" to 6" diameter pole into 24" sections.
4. Wallwood Obstacle Course - 3 participants. Best time wins.
5. Nerdling - 5 participants.
6. Wallwood Marathon - 9 participants. 4 runners, 2 rowers, 2 paddlers, 1 swimmer.

Overall winners will be determined by the total number of points accumulated. Two youth members from Host Lodge will judge each event.


TUG-OF-WAR




