Dear Brothers,

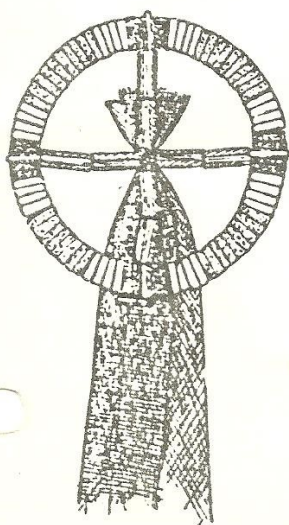
I would like to welcome you to the 1986 S E I Section Seminars. I have put together a training staff consisting of the best instructors in the state and probably in the country.

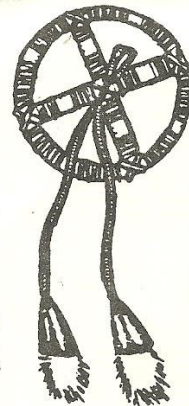

### SEMINAR TOPICS....

Group Dancing: How to form a team, selecting proper dances, selecting costumes, authenticity, research, teamwork and competition.

Camp Promotion: Publicising summer camp. having a trained team, relations with scoutmasters, production of "Where to Go Camping" book, National Camping Award Criteria, also High Adventure Camping

Individual Dancing: How to develop a quality costume inexpensively. Individual costume parts, their origin and purpose. The importance and use of color schemes and movement. History of straight and fancy dancing.

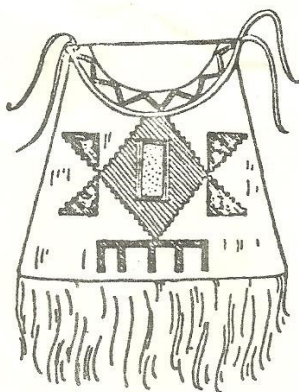
Ceremony Team: How to put on an effective ceremony incorporating teamwork, expression, memorization, gestures, properties, and costumes

American Indian Culture: This Seminar will be taught by a former arrowman who has a Ph.D. in Anthropology. The seminar will include interesting history and facts of tribes located outside of our state, the costuming, shelters, legends, and relations between OA and tribes or hobbyist groups

Running the Ordeal Effectively: The Elangomat system and its importance, planning, troubleshooting, selecting an Ordeal Staff, and the use of the O.A. Spirit of the Arrow Manuals.

Lodge/Chapter Administration: Well-planned yearly program and weekends, social activities, annual banquets, training sessions for lodge/chapter officers, lodge publications ( Bulletins, newsletters, cost and frequency) and the Lodge Executive Committee.

Florida Indians: History, costuming, reasons for clothing as functional and as art, foods, museums, incorporation into lodge dance or ceremonial teams
