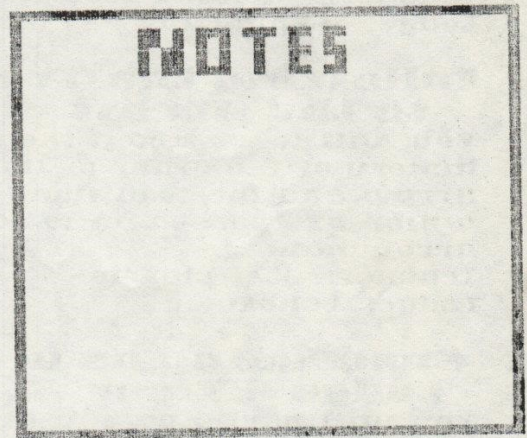

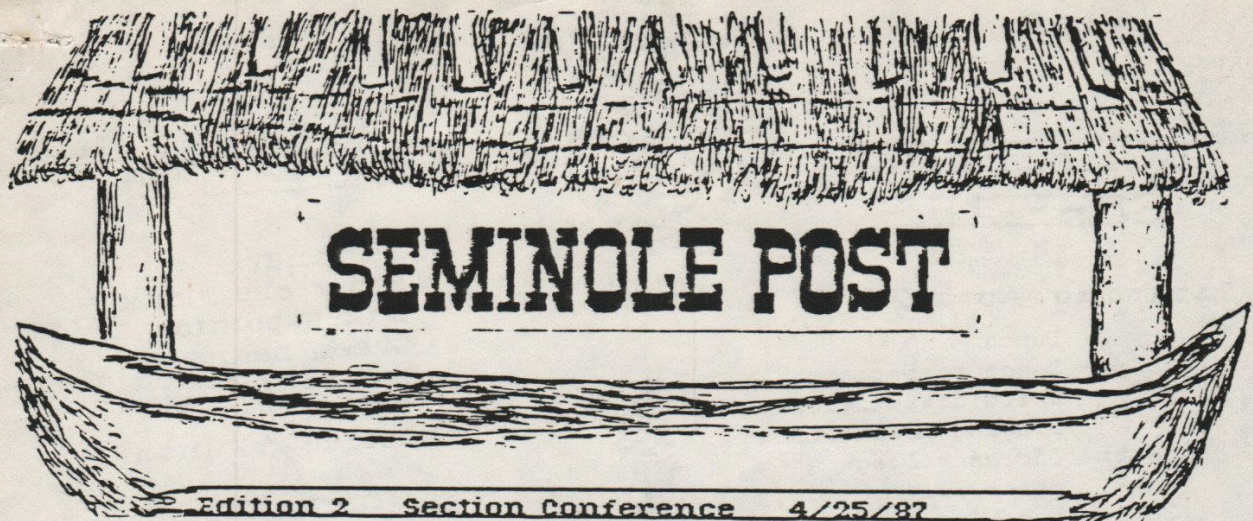

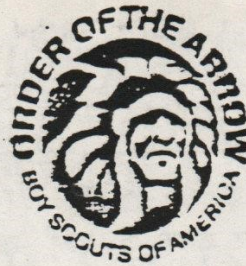

Super Seminars

Keeping the Active

QUEST EVENTS

Obstacle Course

The obstacle course will consist of three members of each Lodge with the best time of the quickest man being recorded.
Time: 2:30-3:00

Marathon Race

The marathon race will consist of four runners and two canoeists from each Lodge. The first runner will run 1/4 of a mile while the second and third runner will run 1/2 mile. Then the canoeist will race across the lake. Now the fourth man will run the finale 3/4 of a mile.
Time: 3:45-4:00

Football Throw

Three members from each Lodge will throw a football for distance. Each boy will have two chances at throwing the ball. Time: 2:45-3:00

Egg Toss

The egg toss will consist of two man teams from each Lodge throwing and catching the eggs. There will be one winner, which will go to the team tossing the egg the farthest distance without breaking it.
Time: 2:30-2:45

Potatoe Sack Race

The potatoe sack race will consist of a two man team with the best time winning.
Time: 3:00-3:15

Archery

The archery event will consist of three members of each Lodge. The best composite score will be the winner.
Time: 3:00-3:30

Bow Saw Comp.

The bow saw competition will consist of one four man team from each Lodge. The winning team will have the best time in the event.
Time: 3:00-3:30

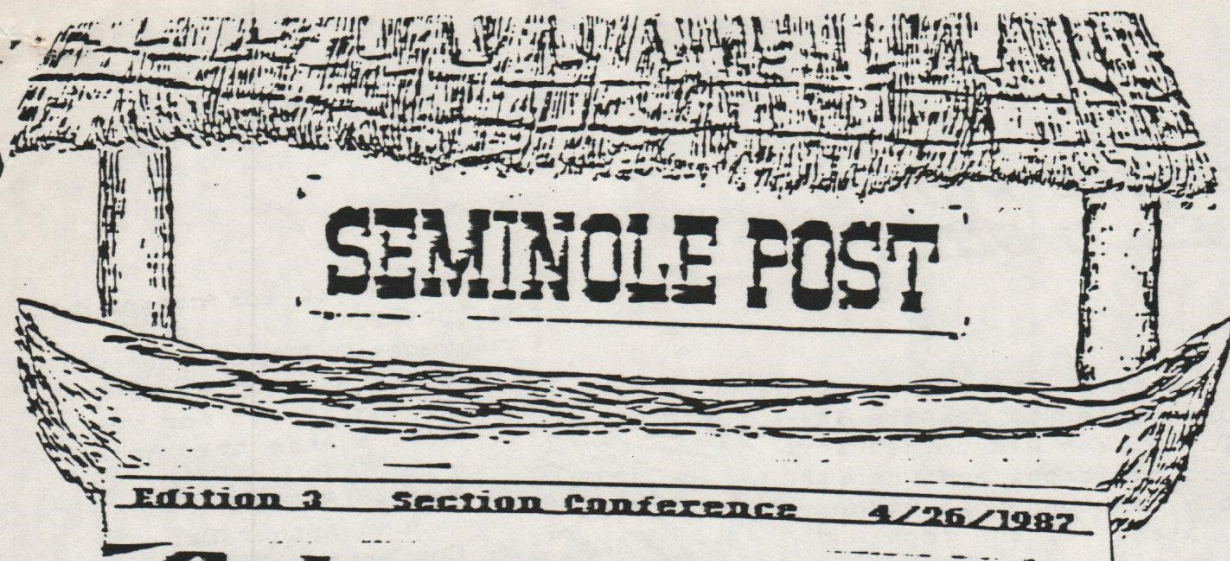
Tug-of-War

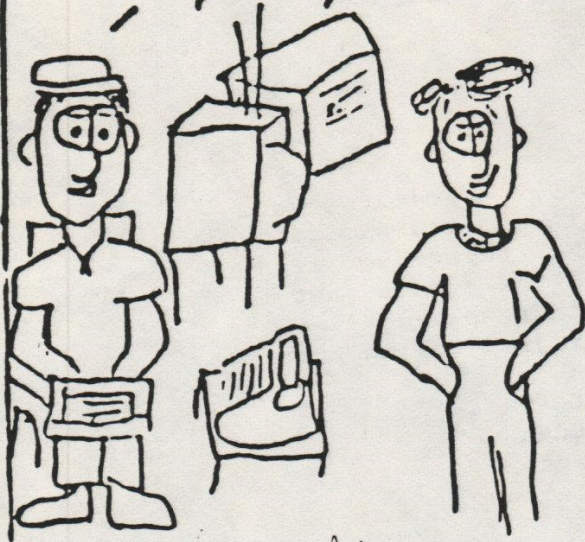

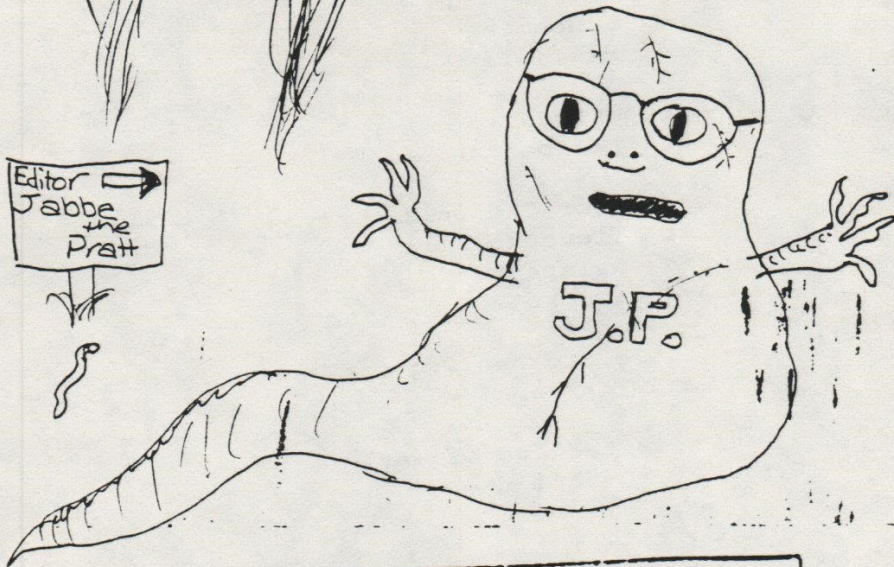

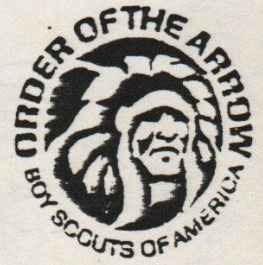
