LODGE - COUNCIL RELATIONS

OBJECTIVES:

In order for a lodge to operate effectively, you must have a good form of communications between the lodge and council, since both of them need each other to get their goals accomplished.

EXAMPLES OF LODGE SUPPORTING THE COUNCIL:

1. Summer Camp Promotion
2. Service To Camps
3. Special Help at other Council and District Events (Camporees, etc.)
4. Council support & public relations through community service.

EXAMPLES OF THE COUNCIL HELPING THE LODGE:

1. Staff Adviser
2. Publications (processing, mailing, etc...)
 - a. Lodge Newsletter
 - b. "Where To Go Camping " Booklet
 - c. Other mailings (exec. committee meetings, call for feedback)

HOW DOES A LODGE PROMOTE GOOD UNIT RELATIONS??

HOW DOES A LODGE PROMOTE GOOD COUNCIL RELATIONS??

- A. Office relations
 1. Get material there on time
 2. Fulfill obligations/promises
 3. Be polite
 4. Put key personell on mailing list
 5. Do things on time (reservations, etc.)
 6. Work with Camp Ranger on projects
 7. Have chapter chiefs attend district roundtables to represent OA
