My Brothers,



Seminar Topics , Locations , and Times :

Building the perfect Slide Show - (Eren Sitki)

The participants in this workshop will familiarize themselves with various styles and contents of audio-visual promotions by assembling a camping promotion slide show. Groups will choose slides, write a script, then present the show for review.

Location : Training Lodge      Time(s) : All four sessions.

Ceremonial Performance - (James Kuczkowski, David Williams)

This seminar will provide both experienced and novice arrowmen with insight into ceremonial performance by allowing them the opportunity to perform part of the pre-ordeal ceremony for constructive criticism on a non-competitive level.

Location : Sioux Shelter      Time(s) : All four sessions.

Intro. to Individual Dancing - (Chris Miller, Andy Taylor, Craig Jackson)

This session will start with an introduction to the various styles of dancing. After this the participants will split into groups and work on the style they are interested in.

Location : Pioneering Shelter.      Time(s) : All four sessions.

Finger Weaving - (Rick Obermeyer)

An introduction to this simple weaving technique used by the Seminole Indians.

Location : Chickee      Time(s) : Session 2 only

Lodge Simulator - (John Lapham, Billy Schilling, Chris Barnash, David Simons, A.J. Kutyna)

This is a challenging role-playing game where participants experience the trials and triumphs of lodge administration by forming a lodge and running it during the fictional month of "Ocvementer".

Location : Seminole Shelter      Time(s) : All four sessions.







Newsroom Workshop - (Jason Jackson, Mike Holland)

This workshop will provide an overview of publication development and construction. Paste up and desk top methods will be covered. Participants will learn through hands on experience.

Location : Trading Post      Time(s) : All four sessions.

Seminole History and Craft - (Rick Obermeyer)

This three hour session will discuss early Seminole history, old style Seminole clothing, Seminole Wars, an introduction to patchwork (learners will make patterns out of colored paper), modern Seminole clothing and Seminole cooking.

Location : Chickee      Time : Will take all of session 3 and 4.

Introduction to Drum singing, how to put on a group dance and the basics of research. - (David Blackard)

This seminar is designed to give the novice the necessary background to pursue further research in singing, group dances, costuming, and more.

Location : Apache Shelter      Time(s) : Session 2 only.

Advanced Singing ; Question & Answer session - (David Blackard)

Advanced singers are invited to come with specific issues to be addressed and problems to be solved.

Location : Handicraft Shelter      Time(s) : Session 3 only.

The Science and Art of Tipi Erecting. - (Capp and Justin Pratt)

Learn about this amazing portable habitat through discussion and by erecting and taking down a tipi. Tipi etiquette, custom, and furnishings will also be discussed.

Location : Parade Field (in front of Trading Post)  
Time(s) : All four sessions.
