Timuquan Theater

Tonight and tomorrow night here at Sand Hill council ring will be the entertainment center of Weekiwachee. Two spectacular shows will be presented; tonite's, "a parody of MTV's Remote Control", and tomorrow's "Blues' Brothers".



Both productions have been staged by Chris Barnash, 18, a Brotherhood Member of Timuquan, who has worked both technically and dramatically with his staff. Tonite's performance, starting at 9:00, will feature 4 actors on Barnash's staff, and ten others working technical.

Tomorrow's show, beginning at 8:00 and expected to run around 45 minutes and will feature 15 actors and 10 technical, some of which are not on his current staff as of yet.

Barnash has worked very hard on producing these shows. It took around 20 hours preparation, (including sound cues lighting and other various technical aspects of the theatre) and around 25 hours of rehearsal time.

We of Timuquan Lodge praise Chris Barnash's outstanding efforts for the production of what we feel will be two of the best O.A. shows ever.



The Dance Arbor




Over the course of the weekend you may notice a large, rustic wooden structure in the middle of camp. This building is an Indian arbor that was used for pow-wows when the Indians roamed freely in North America. A place Indians gathered for competition and friendly conversation, the arbor will do the same for us this weekend as it did for them centuries ago.

Clay Brook, a Brotherhood member, and Ron Woolums, a Vigil Honor Member, had the idea of an arbor approved last November at the Council of Chiefs. Construction of the arbor began in January. Brook, 14, chairman of the Timuquan dance team had a crew of around 30 people (mostly dance team) working on the project three weekends including one Ordeal Weekend. The entire arbor is made of about 100 pine saplings lashed together with twine and thatched with palm leaves.

The arbor is going to be used, this weekend, for most of the Indian events. During the day Indian events and crafts will be held there. Saturday night the arbor will host the annual pow-wow and possibly the Festival of Feathers. Three cheers to the Timuquan Lodge 340 Dance Team members for a job well done!






