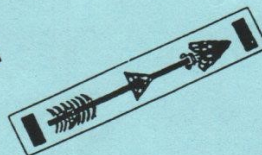
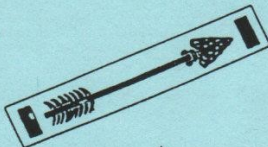
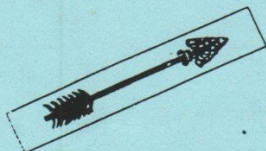

#### SYMBOLS, SYMBOLS, SYMBOLS

This year's conference items are full of symbolism. The 9 turtles on the conference patch and the 9 chickens on the neckerchief represent the 9 lodges of our section. The 6 dancers on the neckerchief represent the 6 original lodges of our section. As revealed at the Friday show, the 4 bands on the patch and other items represent: Fire- Cheerfulness, Turtle- Service, Man-on-Horseback- Leadership, and Diamond- Spiritual Strength.

#### WHO IS ON THE NECKERCHIEF??

The man on the conference neckerchief and host flap is Cory Osceola. Cory was born in 1893 on Pine Island, west of Ft. Lauderdale. While a young man, Cory lost his left arm in an accident, hence on the neckerchief you only see his right hand. This handicap, however, did not discourage him in his lifelong career of leadership. Because of his command of English and his abilities to deal with both Indians and Whites alike, Cory soon emerged as a leader of the non-reservation Seminoles who wanted nothing to do with the reservation government. When Osceola Lodge 564 was founded, many of the members knew Cory, and the lodge was named in his honor. His son, O.B., and family are here at our conference. They have carried on for Cory, sponsoring several Indian Festivals in Naples and Ft Myers. [includes information gathered by Patsy West]

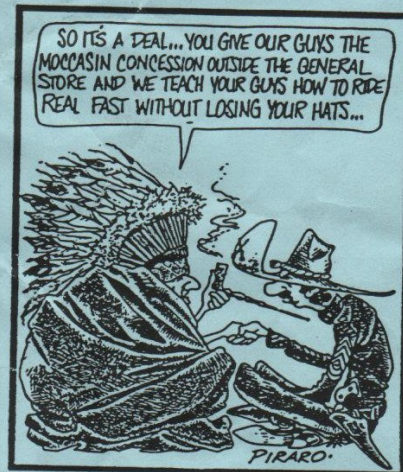
