I hope that you enjoy the weekend and find the Seminars to be a worthwhile experience.

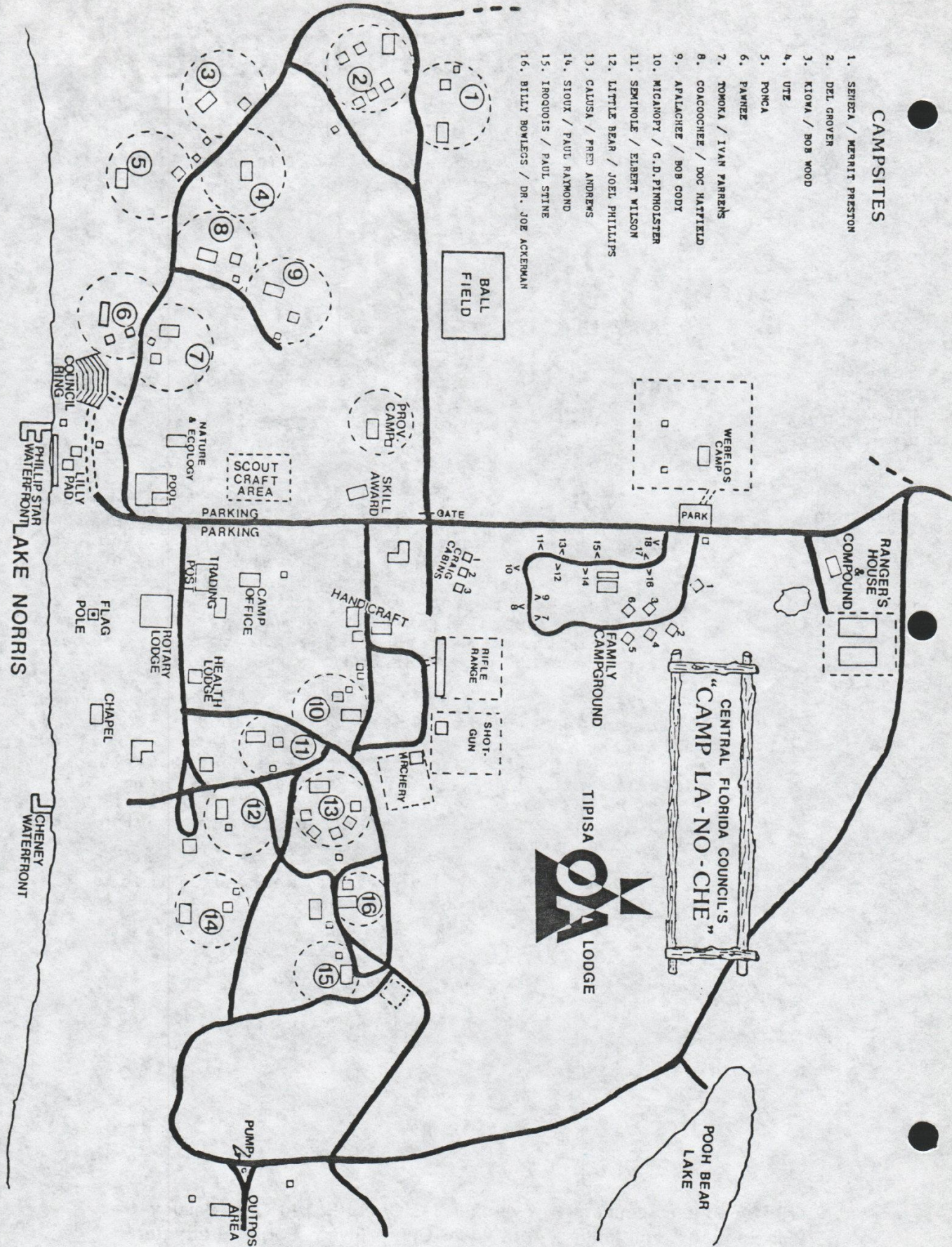

Fancy and Traditional Bustle Construction - Learn tips on bustle construction and bulk purchasing that will enable you to make a very nice set of low-cost bustles. [By Ron Bell, Craig Jones, and Jeff Maier]

Seminole Clothing - Learn how to make a 19th century Seminole outfit from top to bottom, including construction shortcuts and comparative studies with lots of visual aids. [By Rick Obermeyer]

Plains Hard-Sole Moccasins - This session covers basic construction, including ornamentation and pattern making. [By Jeff Maier]

Seminole Patchwork and Pumpkin Bread - Discover the evolution of Seminole patchwork from its beginnings in the early 1900's to the styles of today, while feasting on delicious Seminole pumpkin bread.

## MEET THE TRAINERS

Bill Armstrong - Bill, a member of Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge, placed second nationally in grass dance at the 1990 NOAC, as well as placing first at SE-1 Conferences.

Ron Bell - Ron, the O-Shot-Caw Lodge Adviser and DSA recipient, has been active in Native American activities longer than many of us have been alive. He has served as Head Judge of Indian Events for SE-1 and Head Judge for Fancy Dance Competition at NOAC.

Jason Jackson - Jason is a former Chief of Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge and the Head Judge for Indian Events at the 1992 SE-1 Conference. He is currently doing graduate work at the University of Indiana, focusing on southeastern Indian tribes.

Craig Jones - Craig is an experienced craftsman and dancer from Aal-Pa-Tah Lodge who placed first two years in a row in Traditional Dance at the Section Conference and made the top 10 at the 1990 NOAC.

Jeff Maier - Jeff is a member of Tipisa Lodge who has many years of craft and dancing experience. In addition, he recently attended Red Earth 1991, the largest inter-tribal pow wow in the world.

Rick Obermeyer - Rick hails from Tipisa Lodge, and is a DSA recipient, as well as the former SE-6 Advisor. He has made extensive studies of Seminole Indians for many years, culminating in editing the book 19th Century Seminole Men's Clothing.

Dana Rodakis - Dana is a member of Timuquan Lodge, where he is the head singer for the lodge drum. He will also be leading the drum at the Saturday night pow wow.
