

#### **CONFERENCE INFO & ACTIVITIES**

- SAFETY First Aid/Safety is headquartered in the Ames Lodge (#18 on the Conference Map). This facility will be manned 24 hours a day throughout the conference.
- MEALS Breakfast Saturday and Sunday, and Dinner on Saturday will be served in shifts. The meal band in your packet is J be coordinated with the Conference Schedule. Saturday lunch will be an open meal, with no particular times based on meal bands. In addition to the Taylor Dining Hall, lunch on Saturday will be served as "Meals on Wheels" throughout camp. Areas where competitions are running through lunch can benefit from this service. Meals on Wheels will stop at each competition site some time between 11:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M. Saturday.
- ORDEAL LUNCHEON A special luncheon will be held on Saturday at 12:00 P.M. honoring all Ordeal members at the conference. If you are an Ordeal member of the Order of the Arrow, you, along with your lodge chief, are invited to attend this special luncheon. The Ordeal Luncheon will be held at the Taylor Dining Hall (#20 on the Conference Map).
- QUEST FOR THE GOLDEN ARROW The Quest for the Golden Arrow will be held in the afternoon on Saturday and will include: (1) B.P. Marathon, (2) O.A. Jeopardy, (3) Holey Drums, (4) Obstacle Course, (5) Friction Bridge, (6) Lodge Challenge, and (7) Peanut Butter Invitational. Three additional events are not part of the Quest, but each has an award of its own: (8) Volleyball, (9) Tug-of-War, and (10) Adult Sink-A-Thon.
- S-4 BROTHERHOOD BASH Following the Indian Events Competition on Saturday evening, everyone in camp is invited to a section-wide bash. The S-4 Brotherhood Bash will be held in the area between the Meninak and Ames Lodges. Ice Cream will be served to you by your leaders of the section. The party celebrates 10 years of Section SE-1's past and officially welcomes the new Section S-4.
- VIGIL BREAKFAST A Vigil Breakfast will be held Sunday, at 6:00 A.M. All Vigil Honor Members are invited to attend this special breakfast at the Taylor Dining Hall. Cost is \$2.00
- CH SERVICE A non-denominational church service w. held on Sunday morning at the Camp Chapel. The Chapel (#22 on the Conference Map) is located at the end of a path in front of the Taylor Dining Hall.

#### TRAINING SEMINARS

The training seminars will take place Saturday morning, between 9:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. With the exception of the Native American seminars, the sessions will be held around the area between the Meninak and Ames Lodges. Native American seminars will be held in the area surrounding Dance Arbor. Signs will be posted directing you to exceed the seminar.

- The Effective Adult. (From the standpoint of both an adult and a youth.) This seminar is designed to give both youth and adults a perspective on the adult role in the lodge.
- 2. The New Call Out Ceremony. This seminar is designed to give Arrowmen from around the state the opportunity to see the new Call Out Ceremony. This seminar will present the ceremony and review the procedures on how to implement it in your lodge.
- 3. Arrowmen Sharing Knowledge (ASK). This seminar will feature ideas on the ASK program developed by National two years ago. The seminar will give ideas on how to start and maintain the program in your lodge.
- 4. How to be an Effective Trainer. This seminar is designed to give helpful hints on how to better yourself as a trainer in your lodge, but most importantly in your troop.
- 5. Unit Elections. This seminar will feature the new video produced by the National Committee of the Order of the Arrow. Along with the video, Arrowmen will be given helpful hints on every aspect of an effective Unit Election.
- Improving Lodge/Unit Relations. This seminar will
  present ideas on how an Arrowman can improve
  relations between his troop and his O.A. lodge.
- 7. An Explanation of the Ordeal. This seminar provide an in-depth look at the Ordeal ceremonies. seminar will focus on ceremonial symbolism.

#### TRAINING SEMINARS

- 8. Camping Promotions. This seminar will provide ideas on how to use the items supplied by National, your council, and your lodge to better your camp promotions. The seminar will inform Arrowmen of how to provide a proper camp promotion, and help you develop a successful program.
- Finger Weaving. This seminar will present the finger weaving technique created by the Seminole Indians. Arrowmen will be given the opportunity to learn the technique and to see various finger woven items.
- 10. Basic Dance Styles. This seminar will explore several of the most popular dance styles used by the Indians today. Arrowmen will be able to see various dance clothes and possibly learn how to dance.
- 11. Singing. This seminar will give Arrowmen the opportunity to hear some of the best Drums in the Section. You will be given ideas on how to become a better singer and drummer.
- 12. Dance Clothes. This seminar will give Arrowmen the opportunity to see various types of Indian clothing. You will be given detailed information regarding the "traditions" behind the various types of dance clothes and receive helpful hints on creating your own clothes.
