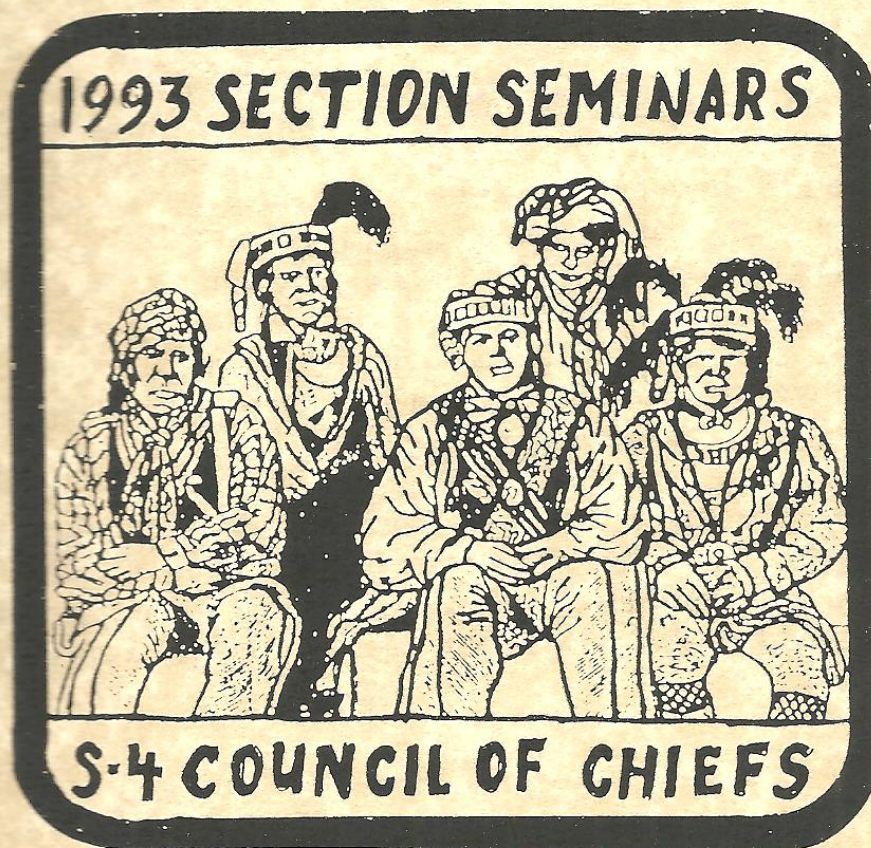

Mike Brown is from Osceola Lodge 564 and contributed to 19th Century Seminole Mens Clothing.

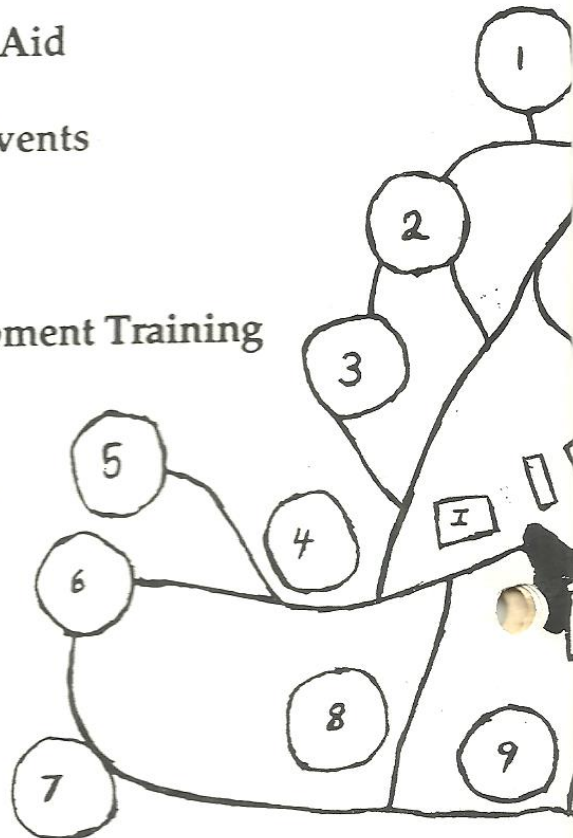
Personal Development

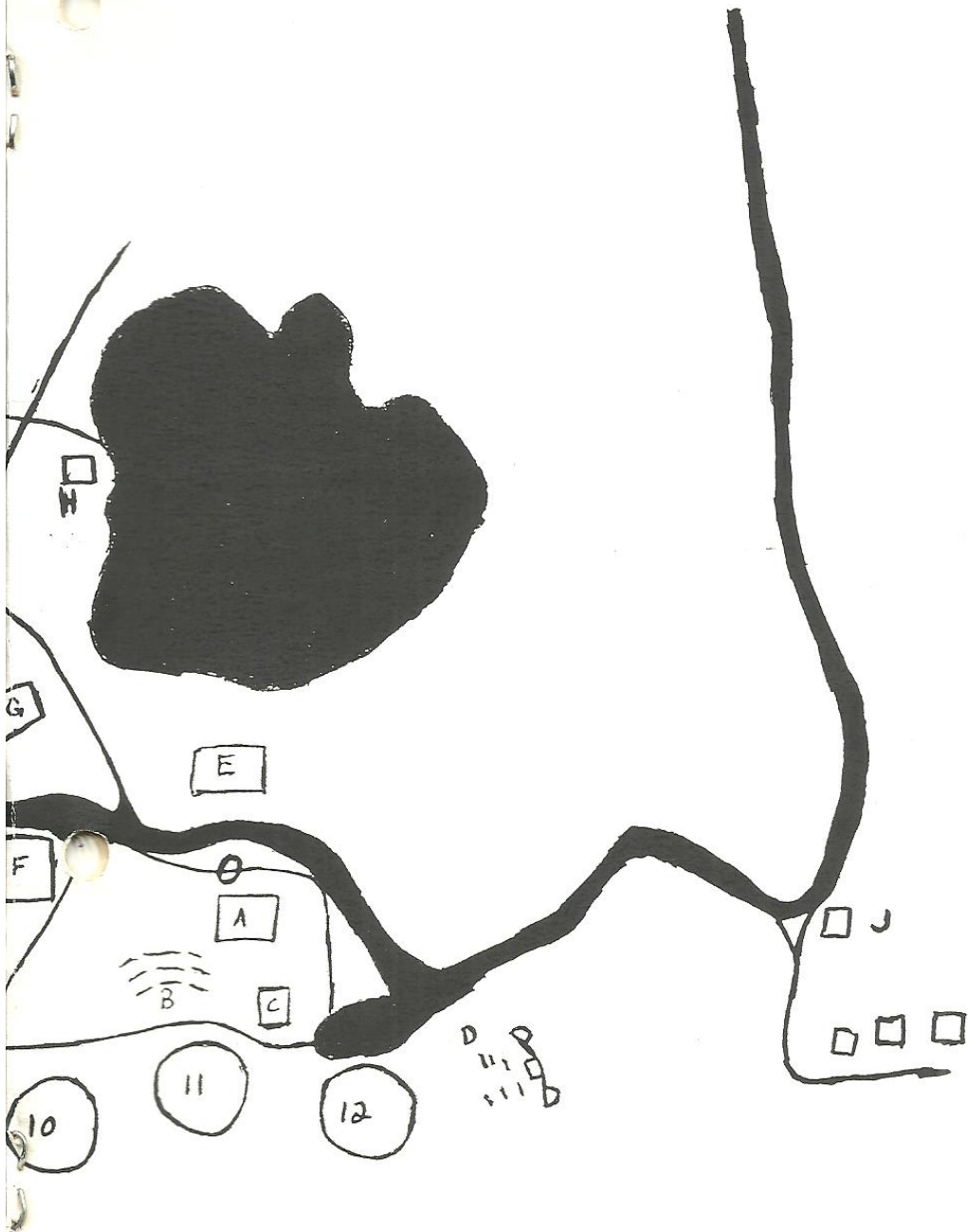
