

---



## SPECIAL EVENTS

---

**Lodge Spirit Award:** This award will be based on the involvement of all of the members of your lodge in the conference activities as well as the spirit of brotherhood shown by your lodge members.

**Volleyball:** This eight man team must try to get to 15 first, winning by two. Single elimination!

**Sinkathon:** Each Lodge Adviser and Lodge Staff Adviser will work together as a team. Each team will be supplied with one #10 can, one paddle and a canoe. At the start of the event, each lodge may begin to dump water into other canoes, but may not bail from their own canoe. After a team's canoe has been sunk, they must empty their canoe and return to shore.

**Giant Monopoly:** In an effort to break a world record, Tipisa is creating the largest Monopoly board ever. Each lodge is encouraged to participate in order to be part of this world record!

**Best Trained Lodge Award:** At each seminar, each lodge member must sign their name on the appropriate page to signify participation at the seminar. The lodge with the largest percentage of seminar attendance will win.

**La-No-Che Mini-Marathon:** This early Saturday morning run will circle the terrain of Camp La-No-Che. Awards will be given to individuals for the fastest times. Both youth and adults are invited to participate.

**Ordeal Luncheon:** This event is for all of the Ordeal members of each lodge. Special activities will be planned to make this experience memorable for all those who attend.

**Vigil Breakfast:** All Vigil Honor members of your lodge are invited to attend this breakfast. A \$3.00 donation is requested from each participant.



## THE QUEST FOR THE GOLDEN ARROW

Each lodge will compete in each event and then be ranked from first to last place. First place will receive one point, second place will receive two points, and so on. In case of ties, all lodges that tied will receive that place, and the lodge with the next best score will receive a place lower by the number of ties. For example, if three lodges tie for fifth place, the next best score would receive eighth place, and no sixth or seventh place awards would be given. Each lodge that does not compete or is disqualified will receive twenty points for that event.

After all of the Quest events have been run, each lodge will have their total number of points added together. The lodge with the LEAST number of points will be the winner of the Quest for the Golden Arrow. The lodge with the second least amount of points will be second, and so on. In the event that there is a tie in the overall standings in the Quest for the Golden Arrow, the lodge with the most first places will win. If there is still a tie, the lodge with the most second places will win the tie. Third places will then be used and so on until the tie is broken.

## THE HISTORY OF THE SECTION

The section today known as Southern Region Section Four has lived through many incarnations. In 1942, Area J of Region VI was established, and included the eleven existing lodges in Georgia, South Carolina, and most of Florida. By 1945, South Carolina and the lodges of northern Georgia were moved to Area Z. Also in 1945, the Area J lodges gathered for their first ever Fellowship Meeting at Camp Echockotee in the North Florida Council. The member lodges at the time were Seminole 85, Tomo Chi Chi 119, Echockotee 200, Chattahoochee 204, Calusa 219, Chawtaw 229 (later Pilthlako), Aal-Pa-Tah 237, Suriarco 239 (later Semialachee), O-Shot-Caw 265, and Wehadkee 273. This Area J Fellowship also saw members of the Tipisa Honor Camper Society, not yet a chartered lodge, go through their Ordeal. In 1947, Fielding Fry was elected as the first area chief.

In late 1949, Area J became Region VI Area D. It included Pilthlako 229 and all the Florida lodges except Yustaga 385. This arrangement lasted only until 1953 when the Areas were again reorganized. Area VI-E was created, without Pilthlako 229 and Semialachee 239. Their charter having expired, O-Shot-Caw 265 reentered in 1955, while Calusa 219's final charter expired. 1960 saw the last Ordeal held at a conference, as they had been held at all previous area conferences.

## HISTORY OF THE SECTION (CONT.)

Eckale Yakanen 553 was chartered in 1961. In 1968, Echockotee joined Area VI-C, and Osceola 564 was chartered.

The year 1972 saw the reorganization of the existing twelve regions into six. The new Southeast Region Section 6 held its first Section Conference in 1973. Echockotee 200 and Semialachee 239 rejoined the lodges of peninsular Florida, and Yustaga 385 was also added. Chiriqui 391 from the Panama Canal Zone Council was a member of the section by this time. The first Section Seminars was held in 1975. The Southeast Region rearranged the sections in 1981, and SE-1 was formed. Though Yustaga 385 left, the section was otherwise intact. In 1987, Chiriqui 391 departed to the Direct Service Council.

In 1992, the Region Structure again changed, with the six regions being reorganized into four. This was the genesis of SR-4 which combined nine lodges in peninsular Florida and three lodges in southern Georgia to form the best section ever. Since then, Sunnyland Council has merged into Southwest Florida Council, causing the brothers of Eckale Yakanen 552 to join those of Osceola 564. This year, we welcome our brothers from Echeconnee 358 and Tomo Chi Chi 119 to S

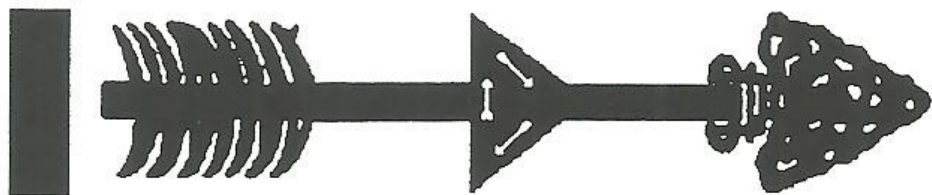

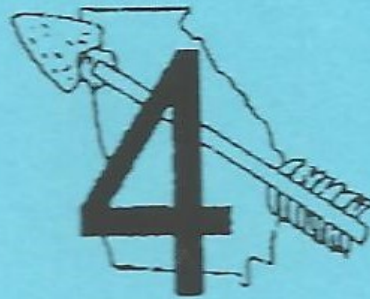
