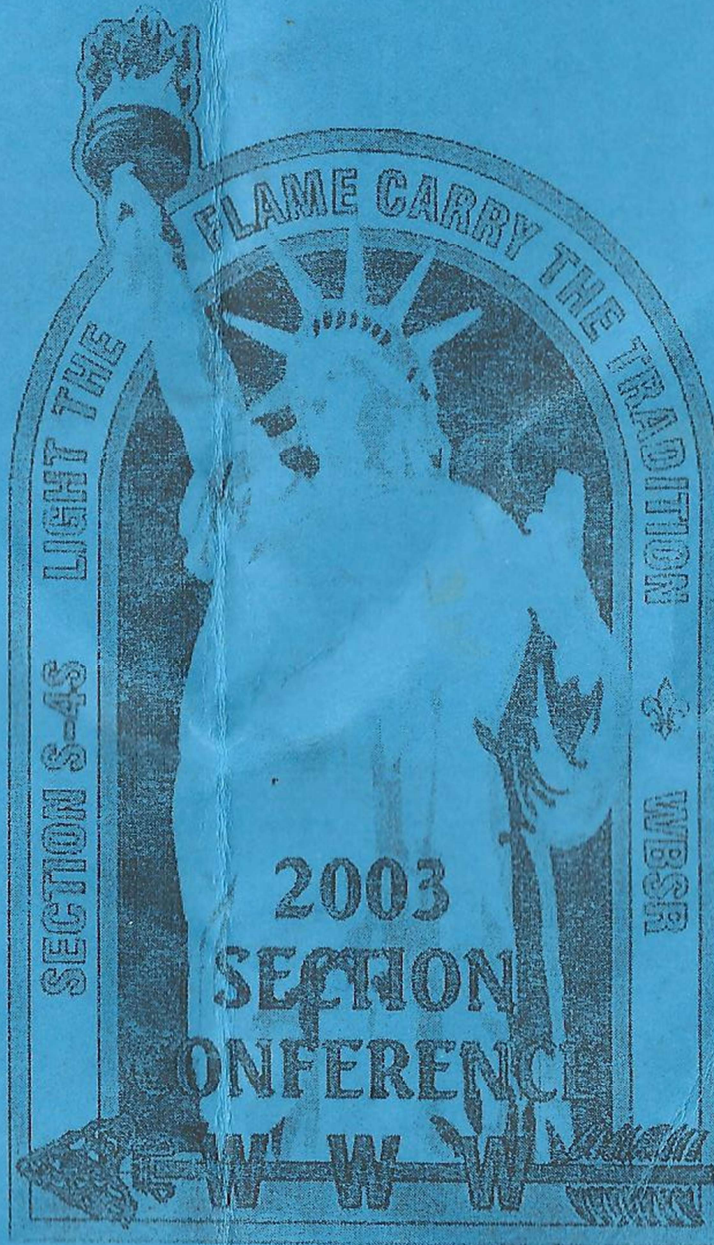
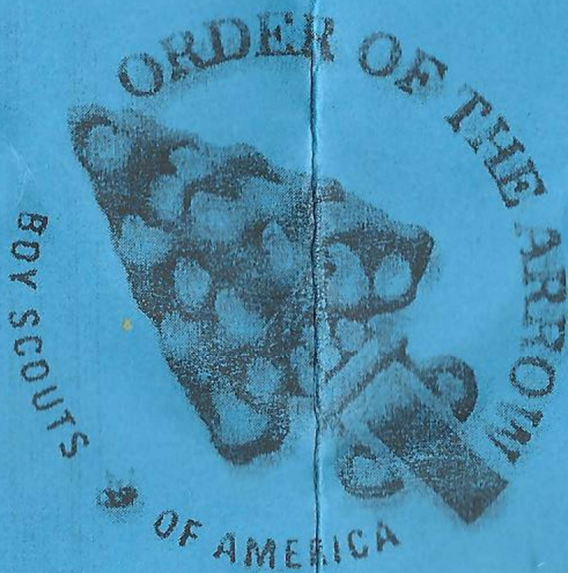

## History of Section S-4S

Our section, known today as Southern Region Section 4 South, has lived through many changes. In 2001, Section S-4 was divided into north and south, by splitting off the five Lodges of the Florida border – Tomo Chi-Chi #119, Pilthlako #229, Immokalee #353, Echeconnee #358, and Alapaha #545.

This all started in 1942, when Area J of BSA Region VI was established to cover the eleven existing lodges in South Carolina, Georgia, and most of Florida. By 1945, the Lodges in South Carolina and Northern Georgia were moved to Area Z. Also, in 1945, the Area J Lodges gathered for their first Fellowship Meeting at Camp Echockotee in North Florida Council. This first fellowship saw members of the Tipisa Honor Camper Society go through their Ordeal. Two years later, Fielding Fry was elected as the first Area Chief.

In late 1949, Area J became Region VI Area D. It included all of the Florida Lodges, except for Yustaga #385 to the far west. This arrangement lasted until 1953, when the areas were again reorganized. Area VI-E was created, leading to the departure of Pilthlako #229 to Area VI-C and Semialachee #239 to Area VI-D. O-Shot-Caw's charter lapsed, but the Lodge was rechartered in 1955, the same year Calusa #219's final charter expired. Ordeals were always conducted at Area Conferences until the final Ordeal at the 1960 Conference. Eckale Yakanen #552 in Bradenton/Sarasota was chartered in 1961 and joined the Area. In 1968, Echockotee was moved to Area VI-C. That same year, Osceola #564 was chartered in Southwest Florida. The year 1972 saw BSA's twelve regions reorganized into six. The new Southeast Region Section 6 (SE-6) held it's first Section Conference in 1973. Echockotee #200 and Semialachee #239 rejoined the Lodges of peninsular Florida and Yustaga #385 was added to the Section. Chirique #391 of the Panama Canal Zone Council was also a member of the Section by this time. The first Section Seminars were held in 1975. The BSA Southern Region rearranged the Sections in 1981 and Section SE-1 was formed. Yustaga #385 left the Section and by 1987, Chirique #391 had become part of the Direct Service Council and left the Section. More changes came in 1992, when the BSA regions were compressed into four and Southern Region Section 4 arose, which covered nine lodges in peninsular Florida with three Lodges in Georgia. Sunny Land Council, covering the Bradenton/Sarasota area, was merged into Southwest Florida Council, with the result that Eckale Yakanen #552 was merged into Osceola #564, making a stronger Lodge – the same geographic area that had been united under Calusa #219 which was disbanded in 1955. Tomo Chi-Chi #119 in the Savannah, GA area rejoined our Section in 1997, with the addition of Echeconnee #358 in the Macon area. Both Lodges had been in Section S-5 and were welcomed by their Southern neighbor into the circle of brotherhood.

At the 2001 Section Conference we said our farewells at the departure of the Georgia Lodges. Once again, our Section S-4 South (S-4S) is comprised only of the eight Lodges of peninsular Florida as far into the panhandle as Semialachee #239 with its headquarters in Tallahassee.

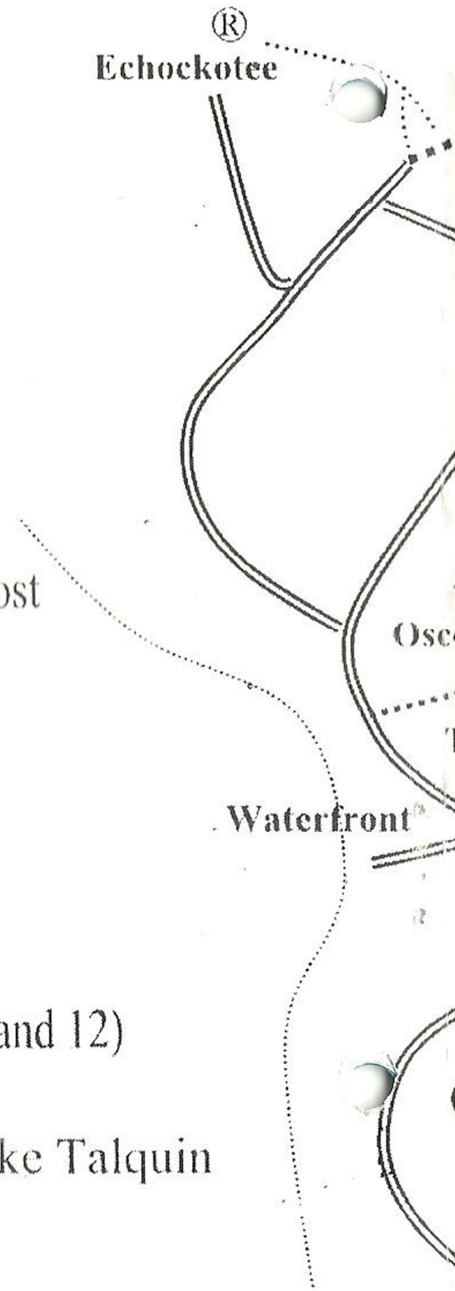
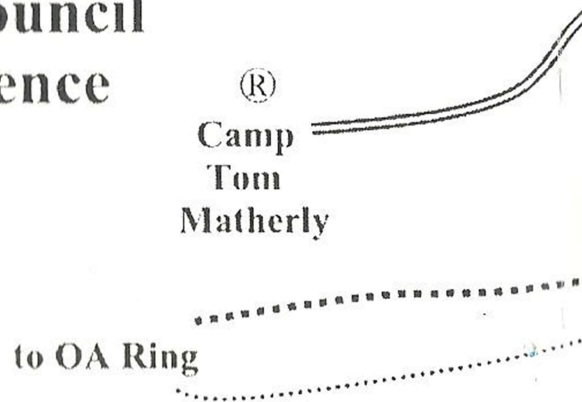

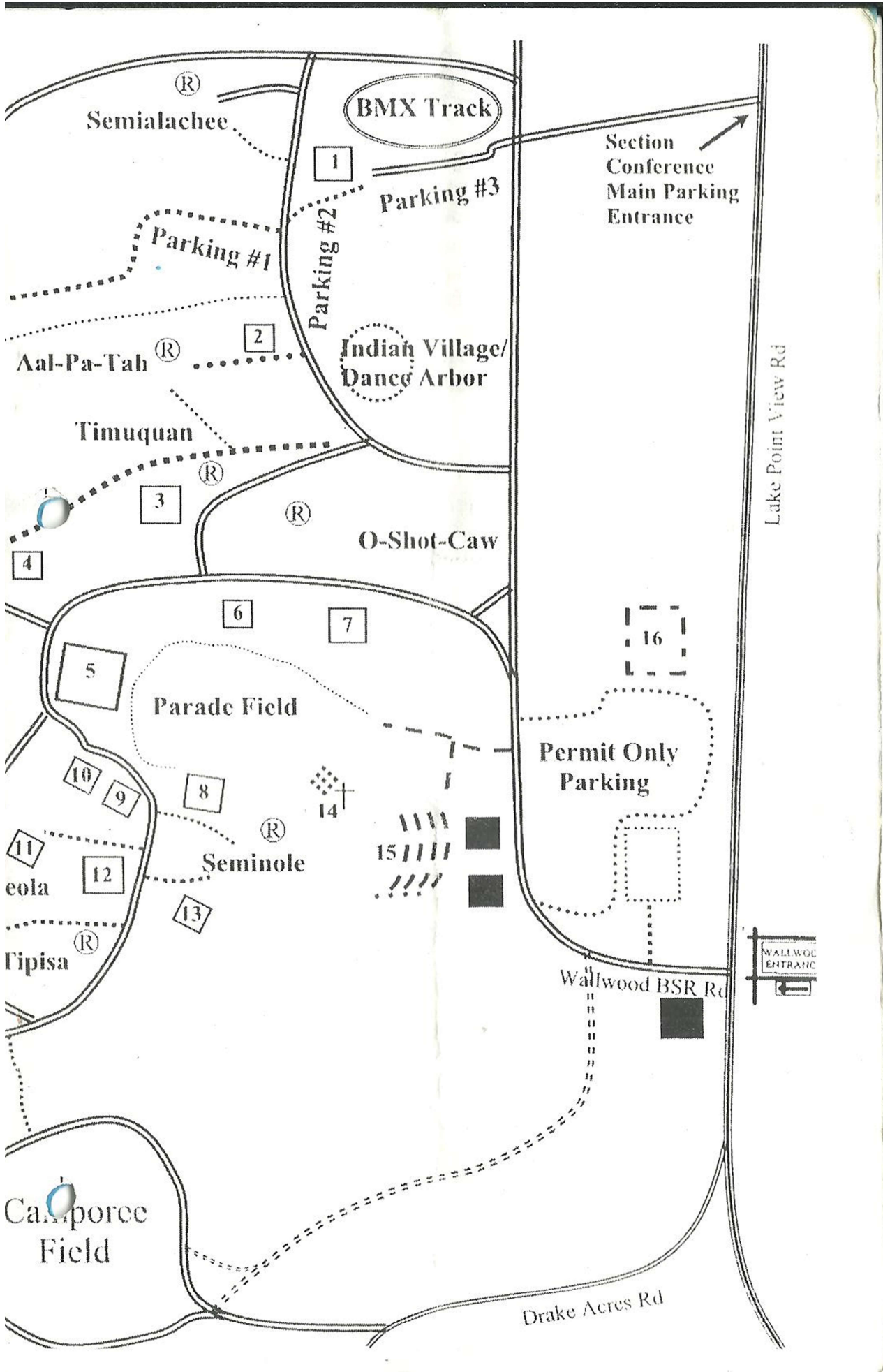
# Wallwood Boy Scout Reservation Suwannee River Area Council 2003 S4S Section Conference Activity/Locator Map

## Quest for the Golden Arrow

### 5K Run

The 5K run will start at 6:00 AM at the main gate and Wallwood rock sign. Each lodge may have an unlimited number of representatives. The runners will follow the well-marked perimeter of the camp. *Run begins at Main Gate.*

### BMX Racing

There will be BMX racing at the state certified Jimmy Crowder BMX track located at the north end of camp. Each lodge may send 3 representatives. Bikes and Protective gear will be required. It is required that each rider wear long pants and a long sleeve shirt. *Located at BMX Track.*

### Volleyball

This will be a single elimination competition. Each lodge can have a maximum of 6 players on a team. The first to fifteen points wins. The rules are standard beach. *Located next to the Trading Post.*

### Horseshoes

Horseshoes will be played with standard rules. Each Lodge can submit 3 players. One round will consist of one member from each lodge. After three rounds, the winners from each round will compete for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place. *Located next to the Trading Post.*

### Water Volleyball

This will be a single elimination competition. Each lodge can have a maximum of 6 players on a team. The first to fifteen points wins. The rules are standard beach except the game is played in the pool. *Located at the Woodward/Proctor Aquatics Center.*

### OA Jeopardy

There will be three representatives from each lodge. There will be five categories and five questions under each category. The categories will include questions about the OA and BSA. The game will follow the rules of the TV game show JEOPARDY. The final round between the 3 finalists will be conducted at the Pre-Show on Saturday night. *Located in the Dining Hall.*

### Wet and Wild Tug-O-War

This will be a regular tug of war game in the knee-deep waters of the lake. Single elimination rules will be used. *Located at the Trading Post*

### Blind Canoe Race

This will be a canoe race where the one paddling is blindfolded and a caller is calling out orders to him to tell him what direction to go. *Located at the waterfront.*

## Special Events

### Adviser Sink-A-Thon

This traditional section event will involve the lodge adviser and lodge staff adviser from each lodge. They will be given a paddle and a bucket with which to sink other canoes. The last canoe floating wins.

### Hidden Arrow

There will be a hidden arrow somewhere within the camp. Clues will be posted and given in the conference publications and at the Friday night show. The first person to find the arrow will receive a special prize at the Saturday night show.

### Lodge Spirit Award

This award will be given out based on lodge involvement in all events and their spirit at these activities. This award is voted on by the host lodge.

### Best Trained Lodge

At each seminar, each lodge member will record his or her participation at the seminar. The lodge with the highest percentage of participation will receive this award.

### BMX

The BMX track will be open all afternoon long and into the night on Saturday. Bikes and protective gear will be provided and must be worn. Participants are required to wear long sleeve shirts and pants. On Saturday, the track will host a very special event. The 1st ever Adviser BMX Race will be held at 5:15pm and will feature your favorite Lodge Advisers, as well as our one and only Section Adviser: Jeff Jonasen, all racing like crazy to be the first around the track. Definitely an event not to be missed!!

### Trading Post

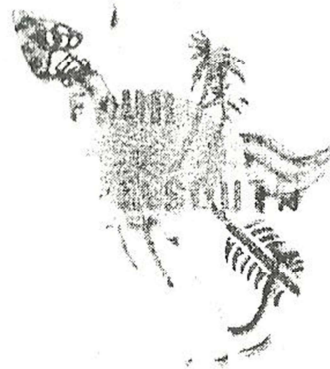
