Section S-4S Seminars Course Descriptions

General Courses

OA and Summer Camp – Over 80 years ago the Order of the Arrow was founded at a summer camp outside of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Since that time, the Order of the Arrow has established a legacy of servant leadership at summer camps across the country. This session will examine the OA's evolving role in the summer camp program and explore ways that your lodge can contribute to your council's camp.

Website Training – Have you ever wanted to create a website? This class will show you how. Section Webmaster Jeremy Fogg is offering a hands-on approach to the process of website construction.

OA Scoutreach Mentoring – Our first duty as Arrowmen is to our units and what better way to fulfill that duty than through the Order of the Arrow Scoutreach program? This session will teach you all you need to know to make Scoutreach a success in your lodge.

Fundraising – Ever have a cool idea that you just couldn't afford to do? This session will take a look at fun and innovative ways to fundraise for your lodge and council.

Chapter Adviser Training – Learn to effectively advise all aspects of the chapter. This session will discuss common problems and difficulties faced by chapter advisers and offer tips on how to overcome them.

Running an Effective Chapter – Good Chapters equal a good Lodge. This session will take you through the basic steps of managing a chapter and its activities. This session is great for current or aspiring chiefs.

Lodge Historical Display – This session is a chance to steal ideas from the Section Historian and reigning King's Cup champion, Stefan Hester, as he walks you through the nuts and bolts of constructing a creative and informative lodge display.

History of the Founders – This session looks at the lives and times of Dr. E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson. Take the time to learn about how two ordinary men created a nationwide organization and see how the Order's ideals were reflected in their everyday lives.

Lodge Administration (Youth and Adult) – This session will show you how maneuver your way through the bureaucracy of the OA, and it will teach you to manage the lodge's complex committee and chapter structure.

Lodge Program (Youth and Adult) – Have you ever been bored at an OA weekend? This session will focus on getting the most out of your lodge weekends through creative planning and programming.

First Year Arrowmen (Youth and Adult) – LEC, COC, LLDP, NLS, Trail Crew, Voyage, Brotherhood, Vigil, Founder's Award...confused? This session is designed for the new Arrowmen youth and adult. Designed to orient you to the Order, this session will cover topics such as National Structures and programs and even basic ideas such as OA jargon.

Leave No Trace - This session will teach you the skills of its namesake. Learn to hike and camp cleanly in the outdoors. Participants will earn Leave No Trace certification.

Brotherhood Conversion – This nationally written training session contains information about brotherhood conversion from all over the country. Attend this session and learn how make sure your Ordeal members make it to Brotherhood.

Inductions Training

Unit Elections/Call-Out – The first part of the inductions sequence is often the most overlooked. This session will examine how to conduct a successful unit election and a meaningful call-out.

Elangomat Training – The Elangomat is critical to the induction process. This session will give you the information needed to train and manage your elangomats.

Nimat Training – This session will discuss the importance of the Nimat program and will focus on the skills necessary to create and maintain a quality program.

Ceremonies Classes – This session focuses on an in-depth look at the symbolism and progression of the ceremonies. They will also discuss portrayal techniques.

Adviser Training – This session will discuss the proper way to advise a ceremonialist. The class will focus on technique, vocabulary, and solutions to common problems.

Evaluator Training – Three sessions, Beginner, Intermediate and Advance, will discuss the skill of evaluating at various experience levels. Session will provide examples of both good and bad evaluations, as well discussions of evaluator philosophy and technique, this class is a must for ceremonial evaluators.

American Indian Activities

Fancy Dance - Accelerate yourself with the flash and glory of the Oklahoma Fancy Feather Dance. Being the most recent of dance evolutions, this style uses the newest of materials and funkiest of steps to gracefully convey the beat of the drum. Become educated on the clothing and style of this dance.

Grass Dance - The modern grass dancer is a fusion of grace, flexibility, and movement. Join the Grass dancers and their 'blowing in the wind' attitudes to explore the clothing and style of the dance.

Old Style Bustle - Learn to bead strips of beautiful designs the loom work way!

Fan Construction - Participants will learn how to construct and build, hands-on, a feather fan.

Northern Singing/Drumming - The Northern singing style is a high-pitched fast paced song with many variations in meanings of songs. Learn the distinctions of the Northern drum, practice the songs, and learn the customs.

Southeastern - The southeastern group will be presenting various seminars ranging from clothing of the Southeastern tribes to cooking.

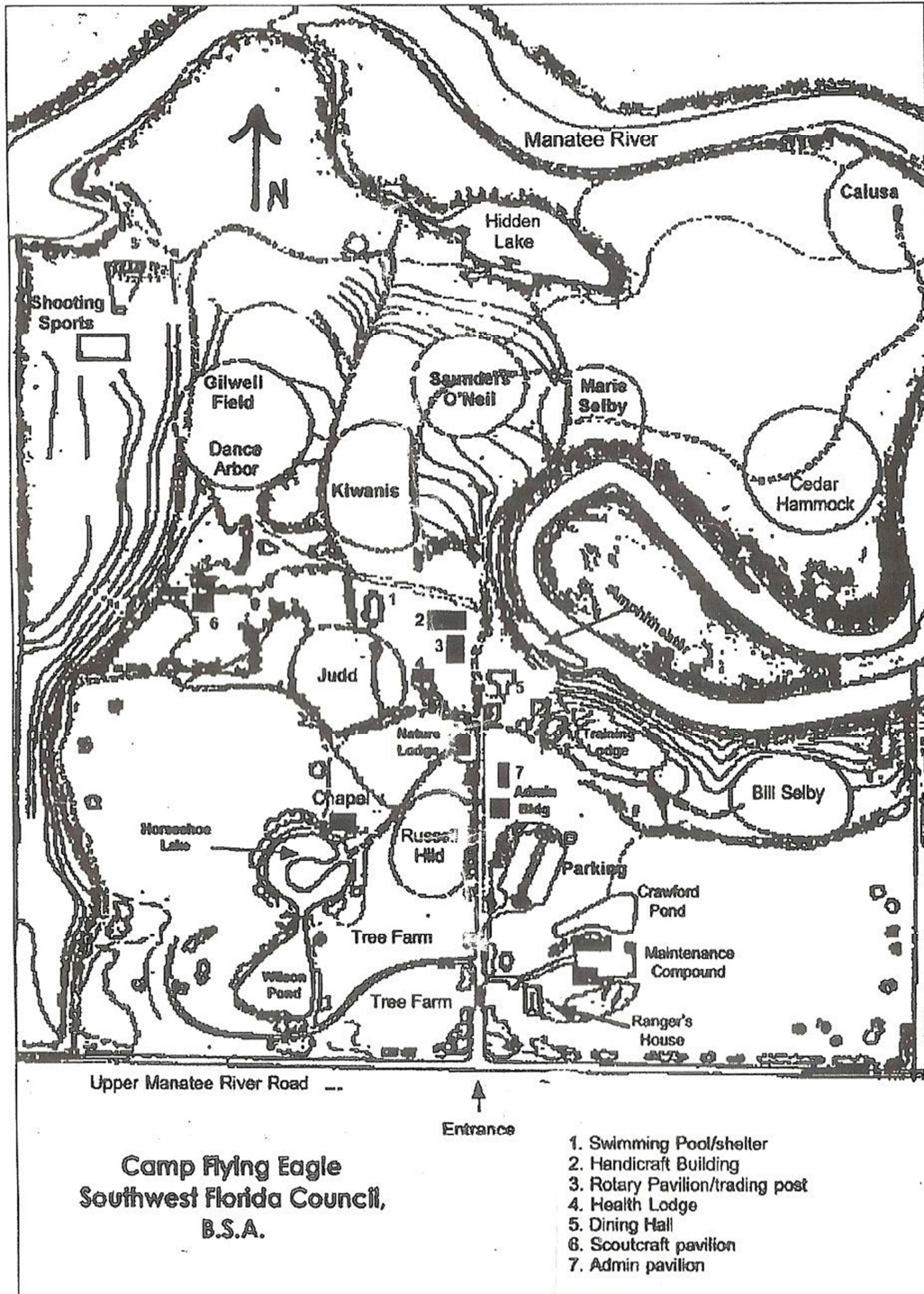
