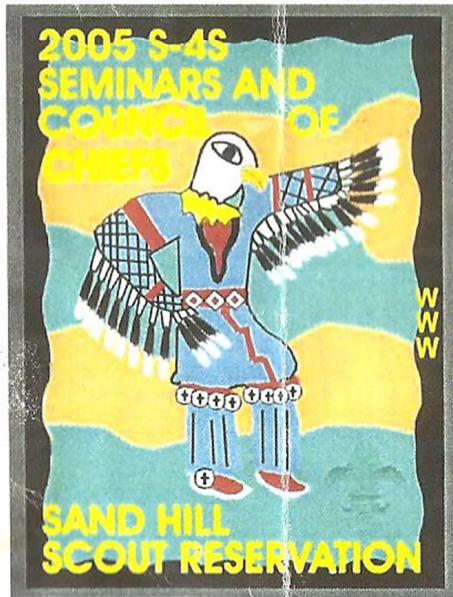

Seminar Descriptions

How to Get Involved (Seminar for First Year Arrowmen)

LEC, COC, OAWV, LLDP, OAOA, NLS, S4S, OATC, Brotherhood, Vigil Honor, Founder's Award...confused? Designed for newly elected youth and adult Arrowmen, this seminar will explain everything from national Order of the Arrow structure and program to everyday OA terminology.

Brotherhood Conversion/Retention

With information compiled from lodges throughout the country, this seminar will focus on the conversion of Ordeal members to Brotherhood honor, with special emphasis on keeping the spark of the Order alive once an Arrowman seals his ties.

Camping and the Order

Since the Order's founding 90 years ago at Treasure Island, our brotherhood has established a legacy of servant leadership to summer camps across the nation. Discuss the OA's evolving role in the camping program as a whole, and explore innovative and exciting ways that your lodge can contribute to your council's summer camp.

OA Scoutreach Mentoring

Quite possibly the most important of the four purposes of the OA, the fourth point of our doctrine states that we assemble "to crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others"; what better way to embody this principle than to give back to your troop? This session will examine the Order of the Arrow's Scoutreach Mentoring program and provide Arrowmen everything they need to make Scoutreach a success on the lodge and council level.

What is Cheerful Service?

Is it hanging out with your brothers? Is it mulching a council campsite? Is it both? A question posed by new members and debated by seasoned veterans alike, this seminar will define once and for all what the term "cheerful service" truly means.

Putting the FUN back in Fundraising!

Often looked at with a cringe, the subject of fundraising strikes many as a boring and tedious project that must be completed before the real fun can begin. Not anymore! Learn how to turn a creative money-making idea from the impossible to the attainable, and your lodge piggy bank will never run dry again!

How to Run a Successful Chapter (Y)

As an involved youth in the lodge, nothing is better than having fun with your fellow Arrowmen at a lodge or chapter event! Perfect for current and aspiring chapter chiefs alike, this seminar will look at the basics of managing a chapter and its activities, and keeping the spirit of the Order alive through the Arrowmen in your district.

How to Run a Successful Chapter (A)

The role of the adult in the Order of the Arrow is constantly faced with difficulties and obstacles. Learn how to overcome these problems and effectively advise all aspects of the chapter. This seminar serves as Chapter Adviser Training, with materials and an outline similar to those used at the National Lodge Adviser Training.

History of the Order of the Arrow

While many Arrowmen may know the bones of our Order's origins, this seminar will expand on that knowledge with interesting facts and little-known details that will surprise and astound all Arrowmen in attendance.

History of the Section

To coincide with the 30th Anniversary of the Section Seminars, this tutorial will discuss all aspects of our section, the many names and faces it has taken, and the unique history that has led up to the creation of the strongest section in America.

Lodge Historical Display

Learn from the best! The 2005 Section Conference King's Cup champions from Echokotee Lodge explain the ins and outs, nuts and bolts of constructing a creative, informative, and accurate lodge historical display.

Lodge Administration

If your interest lies in politics, bureaucracy, and good ol' organization, this seminar is for you! Learn how to manage the complexities of the chapter and lodge committee structures, as well as tips for succeeding in an officer position.

Lodge Program

Bored at a lodge function? Falling asleep at ordeals and fellowships with lack of excitement? Bring fun and intensity back into your lodge program with the knowledge you gain from this seminar! Discuss program ideas from around the section, what works and what doesn't, and use that knowledge to spice up your lodge activities when you return home!

Inductions and Ceremonies Seminars

Unit Elections/Call-Out Ceremony

Probably the first experiences a Scout will have with the Order of the Arrow, the elections process and subsequent call-out ceremony are often overlooked. This session will examine how to conduct successful unit elections and meaningful call-out ceremonies that will leave Arrowmen-to-be with excitement and anticipation and non-members breathless.

Pre-Ordeal/Ordeal Ceremony

This course will look at the different symbols, terms, and influences on the ceremonies, with emphasis on improving portrayal techniques for the individual ceremonialist.

Brotherhood Ceremony

This course will examine the different symbols, terms, and influences on the ceremony, and will discuss the progression of the ceremonies with emphasis on recurring themes and improving portrayal techniques for the individual ceremonialist.

Vigil Honor Ceremony

This course will discuss the different symbols, terms, and influences on the ceremony, and will review the progression of the ceremonies with special emphasis on recurring themes and their significance. There will also be techniques for improving portrayal for the individual ceremonialist.

Elangomat Training

One of the biggest "friends" to the inductions process, the job of the elangomat is critical. Learn the information needed to train and manage elangomats on the lodge level.

Nimat Training

This seminar will stress the importance of the Nimat program, and will focus on the skills necessary to create and maintain a quality program.

Evaluator Training (Beginner)

This session will discuss the proper way to evaluate a ceremonialist. Examples of both good and bad problems will be provided, as well as discussions of evaluator philosophy and technique; this class is a must for ceremonial evaluators.

Evaluator Training (Intermediate)

This session will discuss the proper way to evaluate a ceremonialist. Examples of both good and bad problems will be provided, as well as discussions of evaluator philosophy and technique; this class is a must for ceremonial evaluators.

Evaluator Training (Advanced)

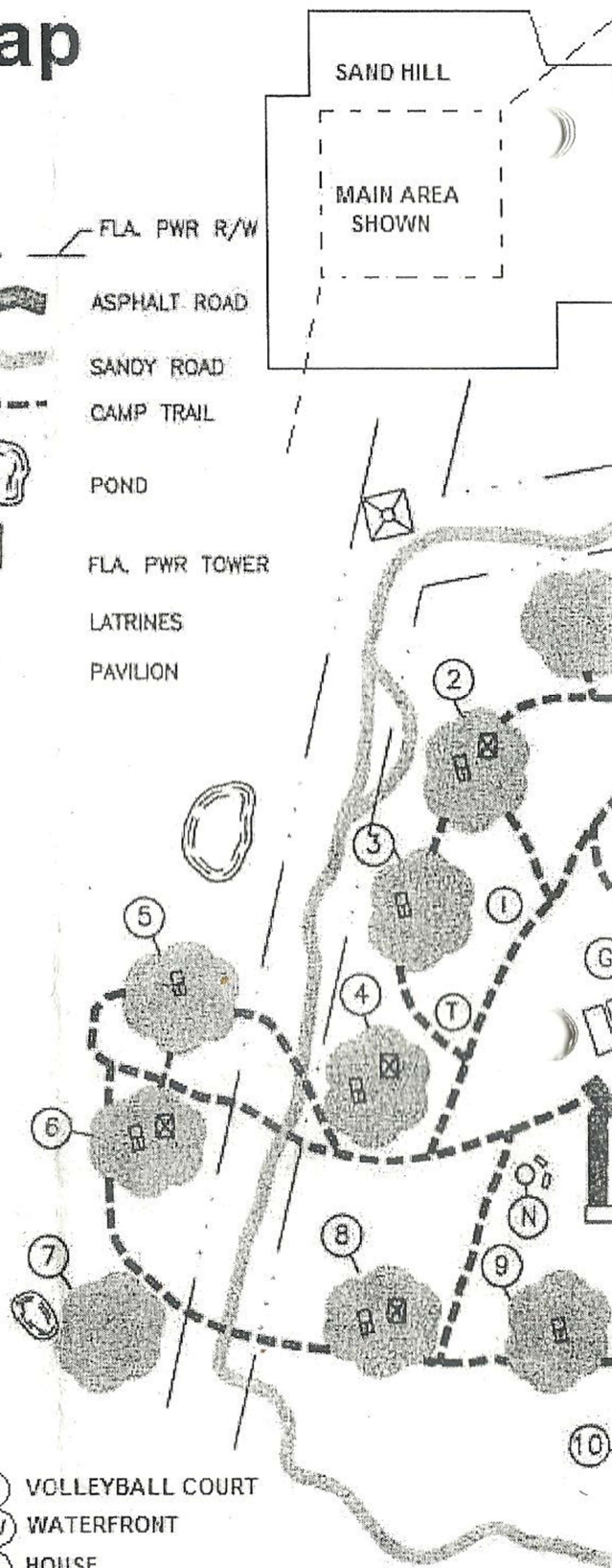
Sand Hill Scout Reservation Main Area Map

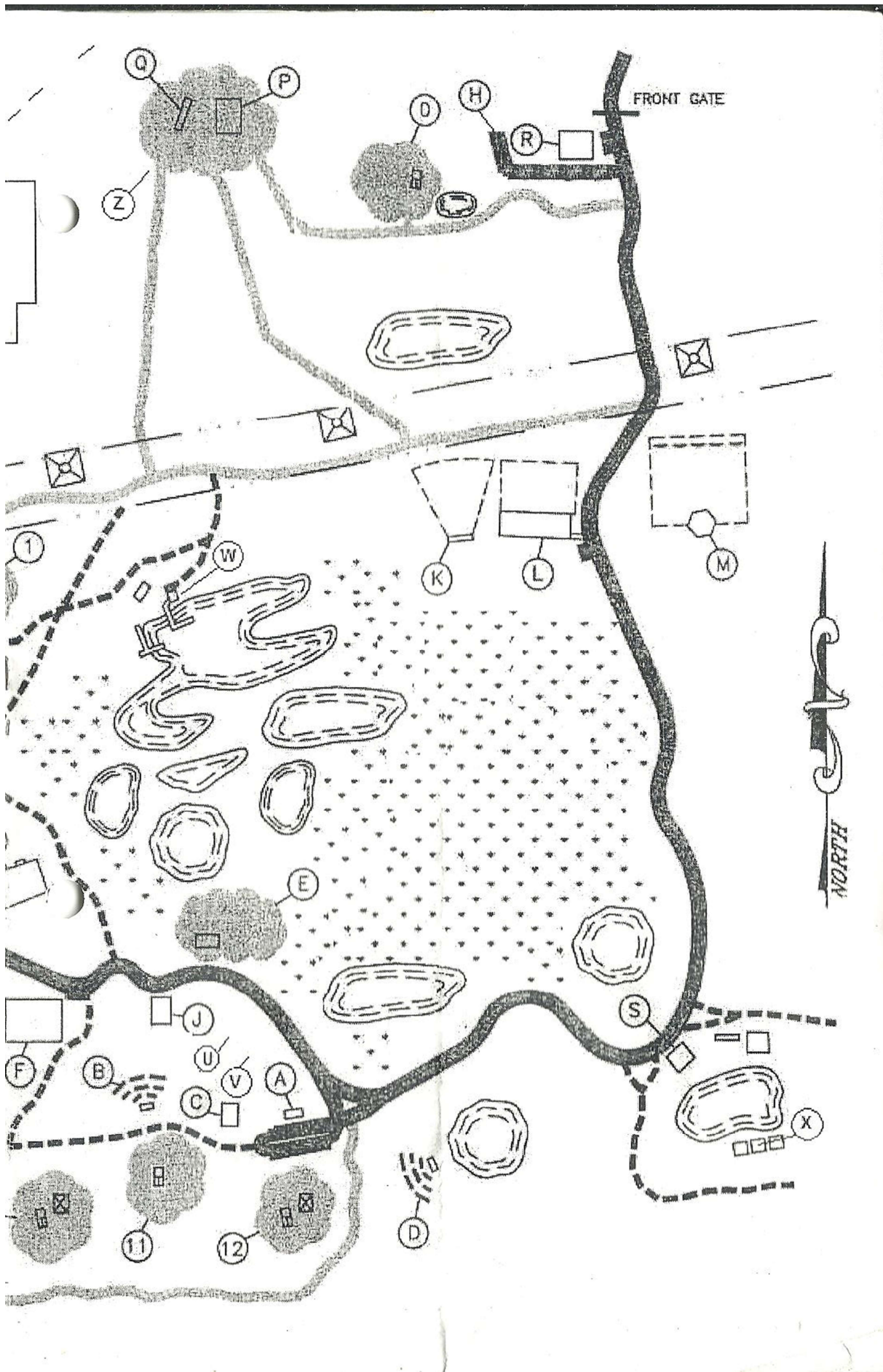

Native American Seminars

Gourd Stitch Beading

Also known as Peyote style, this beading allows the craftsman to decorate dance sticks, walking staffs, or roach pins. Learn the various methods and designs in this session.

Northern Traditional Dance

Explore the style of the contemporary traditional dancers with brief emphasis on outfit and dance exhibition and participation.

Strait / Southern Traditional Dance

Also known as the 'Tuxedo style' of the Native American, Strait dance is the slow and steady style of the South. Learn the regalia and steps which make this high energy, slow-paced dance.

Oklahoma Fancy Feather Dance

Accelerate yourself with the flash and glory of the Oklahoma Fancy Feather Dance. Being the most recent of dance evolutions, this style uses the newest of materials and funkiest of steps to gracefully convey the beat of the drum. Become educated on the clothing and style of this dance.

Women's Traditional Dance

Move with the grace and flow of the Traditional Ladies dance. Learn the outfit styles and movement of the ladies dance.

Loom Beading

Learn to bead strips with various designs on the 'high strung' beading machine.

Appliqué Patchwork

When beading is too complicated, ribbon work is on its way! Learn the tricks behind the manipulation of materials that is the appliqué ribbonwork process.

Northern Singing/Drumming

The Northern singing style is a high-pitched fast paced song with many variations in meanings of songs. Learn the distinctions of the Northern drum, practice the songs, and learn the customs.

Southern Singing/Drumming

The robust southern song is what we traditionally hear as Native music. Join the seminar to learn the beats, customs, and distinctions of the Southern drum.

Seminole Cooking

Learn the cooking styles and methods of our State's Native American

Finger Weaving

Using yarn and knots make a variety of crafts from key chains to belts and knee bands.

Seminole Pottery

Make pinch pots and various dishes used in everyday life by the Seminole Natives.

History of the Seminole

Explore the history of our Native Seminole Indian.

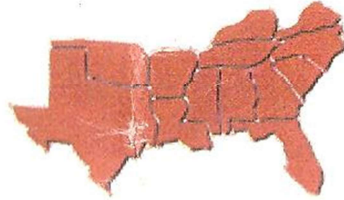
