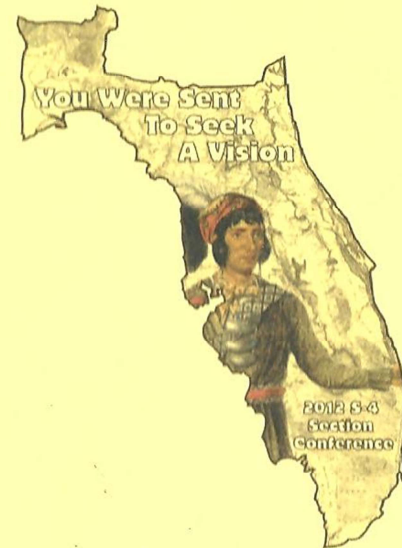

Quest for the Golden Arrow Competitions

Nuclear Fence - Parade Field

Number of participants: Ten youth members per lodge
A small rope will be tied four feet above the ground between two trees that are at least six feet apart. The goal is to get every member from that team over the fence in the quickest time using any way possible without touching the ropes. The winners of this game will win by completing this in the fastest time.

Flip-Tarp Game - Trading Post

Number of participants: Ten youth members per lodge.
The goal of this game is to flip a ten by ten foot tarp completely over with 10 people standing on it without falling off or stepping off. The winners of this game will win by completing this in the fastest time.

Wet to Dry Relay Race - Pool

Number of participants: Four youth members per lodge
This is relay race involving one member who swims in the pool and retrieves a block tagging the other participants who will then race across a field and run back to the swimmer. *Swimmers must take the Swim tests offered from 11:30am until Noon on Saturday or provide certification from a lifeguard.*

Frozen T-shirt - Trading Post

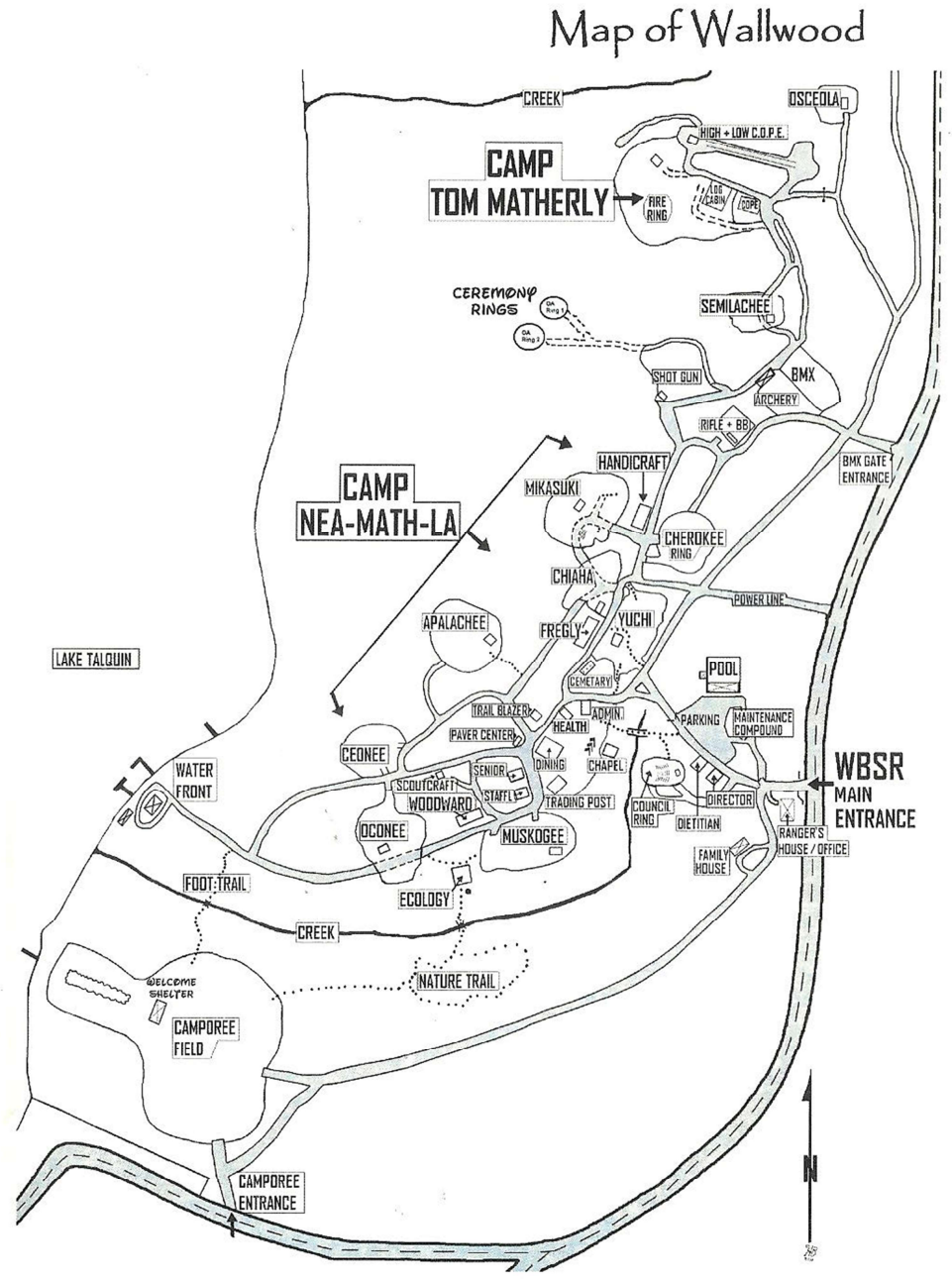
Number of participants: Six youth members per lodge
